turn it up to 11 with Spinal Tap!



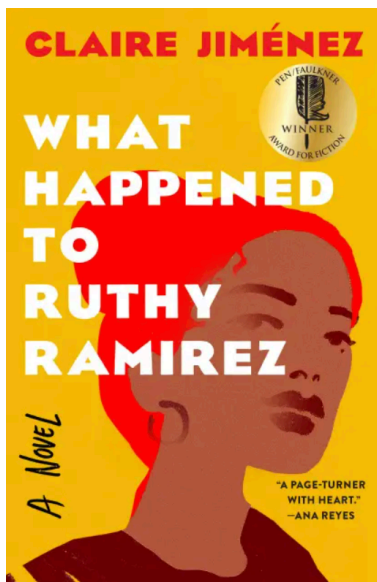
