BOUTIQUE NEWS...The Board reviewed the boutique rules, due to some questions regarding the price point of items in the boutique. The only items that may be priced under \$5.00 by vendors are the greeting cards which may be priced at \$2.50. When we get a charge machine back there will be minimum charge amount, TBA. The maximum price point is to be determined at the discretion of the Boutique Committee Chairperson, currently at \$200.00.

Boutique vendors, please think about rotating your wares, as we need to keep the inventory fresh if we desire repeat customers.

Greeting cards need to be in cellophane sleeves if packaged. Please do not use "baggies". Tip: You may consider a small image of the inside of the card to place on the back, so people will not feel the need to open the package to see the inside of the card, or write "blank inside" on the back label if that is the case. **ART INSIGHT**, our next show is the final judged show of the season. This show is open to both members of the LWAL and non-members. Non-members will pay a higher entry fee, and may only show in one of our open shows, one time.

An open show is beneficial to everyone. Nonmembers have the opportunity to show their work in a new venue and become acquainted with our gallery, league and other artists.

Our members have the opportunity to meet other artists, and view artwork that is created outside the scope of our membership.

Our league benefits by introducing ourselves to those who may not know about us, and it offers the league an opportunity to increase our membership.

We are happy to announce **our featured artist for this show will be Richard Heiens.** Richard won an award for his work in the "Art Restart" show.

Please remember to use only the label materials located in the black cloth bin inside the cubby in the boutique. It is important that the boutique looks professional at all times.

NO SHOWS & GALLERY SITTING... Paying a \$30.00 fee for not sitting is allowed for reasons that a person can not sit... not for a person who does not feel like sitting! Understand that if we do not have gallery sitters our gallery will be closed on those days if we are not notified in advance or unable to get a substitute. If you have not shown up, you are a "No Show". A fine will be owed and a warning given. If you are a No Show for the 3rd time you will not be allowed to participate in a gallery show or place items in the boutique for an entire season and will still owe the fines. A closed gallery hurts all of us. *Calling the gallery on the day you are to sit does not help us. We are not there!*
