## Identifying Author and Illustrator

## **Objective**

Students will identify similarities across texts by the same author and/or illustrator.

## **Preparation**

- 1. Choose several familiar books by the same author and/or illustrator.
- **2.** Make a list of the common elements used across the books. For example, Eric Carle has a number of insect picture books that he has illustrated in bright colors.
- **3.** Have chart paper for group note taking.

## **Procedure**

- **1.** Show students the collection of books.
- 2. Ask what they all have in common, such as the *author* and/or *illustrator*. Ask students what else they notice about the group of books.
- **3.** Create a list of students' observations.
- 4. Ask students if they know any other books by this same author and/or illustrator. Create a list of all titles.

Extend the mini-lesson into independent work by having students pick additional books by the same author and/or illustrator to add to the list made during the mini-lesson.

**Differentiation:** For **below-level students**, begin their discussion with preselected pages where similarities are obvious. Ask **above-level students** to choose three books by the same author or illustrator. Have them create their own lists of common elements.

Assessment Check: Make note of students who contribute to the discussion. Drawing attention to similarities across books by the same author and/or illustrator can give students confidence to pick a new book for independent reading since they feel familiar with the format the author and/or illustrator used. Additional support may be needed.
