An Act relating to oil and gas; requiring certain persons to take certain actions to secure crude oil storage tanks; listing options for securing tanks; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 296.1 of Title 52, unless there is treated a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The owner or operator who owns or has control over a production trude oil storage tank shall be required to do one of the following:

- Install and maintain a locking or sealing device on the thief natch of the tank;
- 2. Reduce the opening of the thief hatch to not greater than six (6) inches in diameter; or
- 3. Affix and maintain a sign on or near the thief hatch which shall meet the following specifications:
 - the size of the sign shall be no smaller than forty (40) square inches,
 - b. the sign shall read "DANGER DO NOT OPEN", and
 - c. the word "DANGER" on the sign shall be no smaller than two (2) inches and the words "DO NOT OPEN" shall be no smaller than one (1) inch.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective January 1, 1995_____
