The USS Mobjack USC&GS Pioneer

One of Kirkland's Best...

You may not be aware of this, but Kirkland has contributed to some pretty significant history over the years. Like it's part in the history of Costco, Evergreen Health, Cascade Investments, and even as the home to the Seahawks for many years. But, while those are worth while companies to write about, did you know that Carillon Point at one time was the birthing place of multiple ships? Some of those ships played significant roles during WWII in the Pacific and some also accomplished some interesting things after the war ended.

Such as the USS Mobjack, which was built by the Lake Washington Shipyard of Houghton, now Carillon Point, in 1942. The Mobjack was originally designed and served as a tender for torpedo boats until 1946 and played an important role in the Borneo Campaign which made it possible for the Australian 7th Division of the Australian I Corps to capture a Japanese-held oil center without a casualty. For her service, the Mobjack received three battle stars.

After the war, the USS Mobjack was transferred to the US Dept of Commerce and converted into an ocean survey ship. She was then commissioned to the US Coast and Geodetic Survey and renamed the USC&GS Pioneer (OSS 31).

In the 1950's, the now named Pioneer, was involved in a joint survey effort with the US Navy in cooperation with the Scripps Institute of Oceanography and towed the first marine magnetometer to study underwater magnetism. In August of 1955, the Pioneer began a west coast survey off southern California. The survey found magnetic data that revealed evidence on the seabed that was not evident in the undersea topography. The "stripes" that the Pioneer found indicated both periodic reversals of earth's magnetic poles and the steady creation of new rocks which spread across the sea bottom as the ocean floor moved.

It was the first time "magnetic striping" on the floor of the Pacific was documented and was a major discovery in the development of the theory of plate tectonics.

In 1963, the Pioneer assisted the US Air Force in Oahu by deploying and recovering a mock-up of the Project Mercury space capsule so that that Air Force could practice parachuting men and equipment into the Pacific to place a flotation collar around it.

Then, in 1964, the Pioneer began her participation in the International Indian Ocean Expedition and became the first ship from the US Coast Survey or the US Coast and Geodetic Survey to visit the Indian Ocean. She returned to San Francisco six months after she departed and had covering 31,507 nautical miles.

For the Pioneer's scientific service, a number of features on the floor of the Pacific Ocean, such as the Pioneer Fracture Zone and Pioneer Ridge, are named after the USC&GS Pioneer.



The USS Mobjack / USC&GS Pioneer was eventually sold for scrap on May 4th 1966.




