## A Message from Ann

As we look towards the beginning of a New Year, I think we all are hoping for more peace and joy in our world and in our lives. This begins, as we know, with what Jesus called the greatest commandment: loving God and loving others. Jesus <u>IS</u> God's love incarnate ~ in the flesh ~ and we are called to spread that love (faster and farther than the spread of the corona virus in 2020!). God has chosen to show forth God's love and light that was made known to the world in Jesus Christ though those who love and follow Christ. This is our calling as the Church, as the gathered people of God. Let us do so with joy and exuberance in 2021!

As we gather for worship on December 27th, we will hear from some members of our congregation what Christ's birth means to them. If you would also like to share briefly about what Christmas, God coming into the world in Christ, means to you, you will be invited to do so during worship that morning.

The new year then begins with Epiphany which means "manifestation" or "appearance." For our Christian faith, epiphany refers to God appearing in flesh in Jesus and, over the years, has become connected with the visit from the Magi. The feast of Epiphany (January 6th) also marks the close of the season of Christmas, the Twelve Days of Christmas.

To begin the year, we will have a guest preacher on Sunday, January 3rd. I met and heard Dr. Matthew Whitaker speak at a Presbytery-sponsored event at Chandler Presbyterian Church on the topic of racism, an ongoing reality that has resurfaced and been brought to our attention this past year in multiple ways. Dr. Whitaker founded the Arizona State University Center for the Study of Race and Democracy where he was a professor of history for 15 years. He co-founded the Healing Racism Dialogue Series and has written extensively on this topic. Dr. Whitaker will be preaching on leadership in difficult times, and I look forward to leading worship with him and hope to have him return to FPC Mesa when he can lead a class for us on the topic of racism.

I wish you all the many, many blessings of God throughout the season of Christmas and in the coming year. Know that you are loved deeply by our good and gracious God!
