In lieu of a traditional mission trip, we decided this year to partner up with the Care Portal ministry. While the Care Portal will be an ongoing mission for those who signed up to receive the alerts from Ellen Hickey, we will do a Care Portal Mission Week starting July 7th and going through July 11th.

For those of you not familiar with Care Portal, it is a website where case workers with child serving agencies who encounter needs of children in crisis can enter vetted needs into Care Portal. We, as a church, can see if we can help

families with as many needs as we can. Each family may need something different (beds, car seats, diapers, child safety locks and baby proofing items are among the most common requests). There are many ways that we can all help out.

We will need people who can help purchase these items as well as people who can help deliver these items. We will be collecting items starting now and then during the mission week, we will gather and deliver items that have been contributed. Please watch for a commitment mailing. We will ask if you can commit items, donate money, and/or help deliver items. Additional details are still to be determined, but in order to make this as successful as possible, we would love everyone to be involved in some way. For now, please prayerfully consider how you want to support this mission, save the date, and watch out for more news and details in the weeks and months to come.
