75th Anniversary: The Joy of the Journey!

Join us for “The Joy of the Journey,” the 75th Anniversary Celebration of First Presbyterian Church, Mesa, Arizona. The Celebration will be held on Palm Sunday weekend, Saturday, April 9th and Sunday, April 10th. On Saturday at 5:30 p.m., we'll gather in Fellowship Hall for Food & Fellowship, then we'll move to the Sanctuary for our program at 7:00! The program will feature special guests, including our city mayor, Presbytery representatives, and young and old children of our church. We'll be blessed by musical offerings from a String Quartet, Voice, and Organ, including Alice & Norm Peterson's granddaughters, Violinist Lorelei Barker & Cellist Kirsten Alexander, and Bass-Baritone Tom Sitzler, who will sing Alleluia! by Ferdinand Hummel and The Lord Is My Light by Frances Allitsen. We'll also showcase our magnificent Visser-Rowland Pipe Organ in a variety of music, including Carillon by Louis Vierne. The special music will bookend our celebrations of FPC history, leadership, family, and mission. On Sunday, we'll gather for a Worship Celebration Service centered upon Palm Sunday and the beautiful ministries of First Presbyterian Church, Mesa. We'll share in music from Dei Gloriam Handbell Choir, the Sanctuary Choir, Tom Sitzler, and Dr. Glenn Bennett. Following Worship, we will conclude the weekend with a Reception in Fellowship Hall! Tickets for the Saturday Event are \$20 for those 13 and over, \$5 for ages 5 through 12, with a \$60 maximum per household. There is no cost for ages 4 and under. Tenebrae: A Service of Darkness - This exceptionally moving work will be a beautiful part of our worship through Holy Week. We will gather in our Sanctuary on Maundy Thursday, April 14th, at 7:00 p.m. Dating from the 8th century, *Tenebrae* was originally celebrated on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of Holy Week, symbolizing the darkness that fell over the earth as the Son of God was crucified. The Dale Wood Service of Darkness includes seven choral meditations on the Last Words of Christ, adapted from that ancient *Tenebrae* and commemorating the final hours of Christ's life on earth as He prepared for and suffered death on the cross.

Our Easter Celebration will be held on Sunday, April 17th, at 10:00 a.m. in our Sanctuary. The worship service will include our Sanctuary Choir, Dei Gloriam Handbell Choir, Hearts Hands and Voices, and Praise Band, featuring Mercy Me's "Best News Ever" and a powerful signing of "God So Loved the World." Join us on Easter Sunday as we gather to celebrate the Resurrection of our Eternal King!






For those of you not familiar with Care Portal, it is a website where case workers with child-serving agencies who encounter needs of children in crisis can enter vetted needs into Care Portal. We, as a church, can see if we can help families with as many needs as we can. Each family may need something different (beds, car seats, diapers, child safety locks and baby proofing items are among the most common requests). There are many ways that we can all help out.

We will need people who can help purchase these items, as well as people who can help deliver these items, and there will also be a prayer team. We will be collecting items starting on Thursday, June 9th, and throughout the rest of the days, we will gather and deliver items that have been contributed.
