A Message from Ann

“Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.” (John 14:27)

This is one of my favorite verses of Scripture and one to which I cling in difficult times. The peace of Christ is a gift I treasure and a foundation of my faith. My prayer during these days is that all of you sense and are being sustained by the deep peace of Christ.

At our session meeting on April 19th, the session appointed a “Re-Opening Task Force” to study and discern safe and prudent ways for us to begin to gather again when the stay at home orders are lifted. Many aspects of our life together will need to be modified, at least for awhile. This is also an opportunity for us to think deeply and pray faithfully about our ministry. What means the most to us? What is essential for reaching out with the love of God to our neighbors in need? What might need to be altered or renewed? Is there anything that we ought to let go of altogether?

The work of the task force will be undertaken with the guidelines of our local and national government and with the recommendations of our Presbytery and denominational leaders at the forefront of the process. We will study many resources and, by God’s grace, discern together a safe and workable plan for the particular demographics of our congregation. Session will receive a proposed plan at the May session meeting and information will be made available to the congregation in as timely a fashion as possible.

Our gatherings may look different for awhile, but we trust in God’s goodness and grace to lead us into an unknown, yet hope-filled, future where we will continue to praise and worship God and grow in faith together.

I would like to close by sharing with you a favorite benediction ~ a Gaelic blessing ~ that was often sung at my home church:

Deep peace of the running wave to you
Deep peace of the flowing air to you
Deep peace of the quiet earth to you
Deep peace of the shining stars to you
Deep peace of the gentle night to you
Moon and stars pour their healing light on you
Deep peace of Christ the light of the world to you
Deep peace of Christ to you



Presbyterian Heritage Sunday will be observed on May 17th. The opening date of the first General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America was May 21, 1789. We will celebrate our heritage with a bit of music education and song on the 17th! We'll celebrate the 30th year of our magnificent Visser-Rowland organ and learn about the various parts of this very complex instrument! Daniel Burton's *Rex: The King of the Instruments* will be offered during worship, and Anita will be our featured narrator. Along with live music, the piece will demonstrate the majesty of the pipe organ and its music.

The celebration will continue as gospel hymns will be the choice of congregation song on May 17th. Philosopher George Santayana said, "Those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it." However, many times we are very blessed to repeat it. On the 17th, we'll have that very opportunity! We will enjoy many gospel melodies.

When choosing gospel songs for our worship services, I typically consult the "Bill Martin" list. Bill was an FPC member who volunteered in our Church Office. He often sang a favorite gospel tune as he went about his office work. When asked to create a list of some of his favorites, he came up with thirty or so gospel hymns, a few of which must have been popular in only his younger years. Playing stump-the-current-church-leaders, Bill serenaded the office with tunes such as *Precious Name, O How Sweet*, which he sang with all of his heart, and which some of you may count among your favorites. We'll have the opportunity to sing some of those (bit more familiar) "favorite" gospel hymns during worship on May 17th. We'll gather virtually while still enjoying the wonderful bond of fellowship provided by great gospel music. You'll be invited to either sing with the gusto of Bill Martin or just enjoy reminiscing while listening to some of the musical pearls which echoed through age-old chapels large and small with the joy-filled strains of our faith-filled ancestors. Join us on the 17th, and be ready to learn about the organ and be in your good singing voices as we dare to repeat some of those good ole gospel melodies!



Mission Trip Update – We have had to make some changes to our Mission Trip due to Covid-19. The Mission Planning Team decided that it would not be advisable to continue our plans to travel up to the Navajo Nation, but there is still a great need there, and so we have changed our mission focus to getting much needed supplies there instead. If you have not seen some of the news stories that have come out, this virus is hitting the Navajo community incredibly hard. We need to support our Native American brothers and sisters and are planning to help two ways. The first way includes partnering with other Presbyterian churches to gather supplies from our churches and have them delivered to the Navajo Nation. So far only April dates have been announced, but if these efforts continue in May or beyond, information will come in the weekly FPC News emails.

Our Second project is that we wanted to do some shipments directly to Tseyi Bidda since that is where we were going to do our Mission Trip and those shipments will continue on an as-needed basis. A special thank you to Sara McWhorter, Jean Chapel, Ellen Hickey, Elly Weinel, Anita Ramsay, and Sue Eisenklam who together made 213 masks to send, as well as the sewing machine donation from Sara so they can sew even more themselves. We will also be sending gloves and hand sanitizer. They also mentioned the need for food and water. Pentecost has officially begun, and we are now collecting for this special offering now through May 31.
