## A Message from Christian

Proverbs 3:5 — Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding

There is a significant difference between a closed hand and one that is open.

This was an insight shared with me when I was a youth, and I still find myself thinking about it, even this past weekend at Montlure Camp.

The concept is that when we are holding on to something tightly, insisting that what we have be used in a certain way, we might easily miss out on what God wants to do with us. Further, if God presents us with something new, how can we receive it with a closed hand. We miss out on what God has for us.

In contrast, when we hold what we have to offer with an open hand, it can be freely shared or added to. It is a matter of attitude that opens one up to opportunities.

I find that when I approach situations, like going to a work weekend at a camp, or a missions trip, a visit to a hospital room, or a move to a new church across the country, with an open hand, I am more ready to be used by God, as well as receive what he has for me.

I wonder what God has in store for us this month? I do know that approaching situations that we anticipate and ones that we don't with an open hand, where we hold onto things lightly, we will be better ready to respond. I am excited and optimistic about our shared future.

#### Reports/Motions

Finance – The Trustees approved the March Financial Reports.

Following the April 6 Officer Training, Session met with the incoming officers and approved them to be ordained and/or installed in worship on May 12.

The Worship Committee decided on Christmas Eve services, and Session approved their motion to have a 3:00 p.m. service and a 6:00 p.m. service.

#### Et cetera

Don't forget - **PER CAPITA** for **2024** is \$38.51 (unchanged from 2023). \$23.71 for GC Presbytery, \$5.00 for the Synod of the Southwest and \$9.80 for GA. The amount we owe, based on our 12/31/22 membership of 240, is \$9,242.40. It would be greatly appreciated if everyone would be able to/could pay their own per capita.

#### I-Help

The I-Help mission is to stabilize people during crisis and transition, build a foundation where people can thrive, and preserve dignity and respect for the most vulnerable. It is a unique, cost-effective program that uses what churches have in abundance (space, volunteers, the desire to help the stranger) to provide overnight emergency shelter to those experiencing homelessness and case management to help them move from crisis to stability. The I-HELP Mesa program began in 2010, and FPC has been hosting guests since its inception. It was so successful that it has grown to include many other cities across Arizona including Avondale, Goodyear, Surprise, Peoria, Phoenix and future programs in Tucson and Casa Grande.

We need I-Help host volunteers! The host volunteer commitment is 2-4 hours on a Sunday night 5:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. and involves providing a dinner meal for up to 10 guests, which can be prepared at home or store bought. Thanks to the very generous donations from members of our congregation, the host can be reimbursed for the cost of the meals provided. The guests are so appreciative and always willing to help with any clean up.

#### **Property Update**

What a difference a year makes! Remember how our parking lot used to look, replete with cracks, chips, and potholes? And how dark it was at night in that "back forty" area to the east? It was about this time last year that the property committee took a hard look at our fundraising and finances and decided to get it repaved. Our spirits were lifted by words of support from church members who agreed that the pavement was increasingly a hazard to people walking to their cars.

Now it is safe and smooth with better nighttime lighting. Freshly painted stripes clearly show where to park for smooth traffic flow. It is sloped properly for excellent draining of rains from our monsoons and atmospheric rivers.

However, in the year since we started work our General Capital Fund is still underfunded by \$90k. This doesn't affect church operations and salaries, but it slows down our schedule for other projects that need attention. Some items we are looking at are:

- Remodel Fellowship Hall restrooms
- Sanctuary foundation cracks
- New alarm system
- Replace front sign

Your faithful giving helped us raise most of that money, and thus we began work on the faith that the remaining money would come in. To do this we reallocated dollars from other accounts, which we are eager to repay as soon as possible.

Our church is greatly blessed with members who generously give of their time, talent, and treasure. Please help us continue our work to make the campus a wonderful place we can use for worship, fellowship, and community service.
