The power of the Risen Christ and the poured out Spirit of God are present in our midst

We continue to celebrate and embrace resurrection life during this beautiful, life-giving season of Eastertide, even as we anticipate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Pentecost falls on the 50th day following Easter and is derived from a Jewish feast or festival. In ancient Israel, the Feast of Weeks, also called Pentecost, was a one-day wheat harvest festival of thanksgiving that occurred fifty days after the barley harvest festival. After the Babylonian exile, this festival also became linked with the giving of the law to Moses on Mount Sinai fifty days after the exodus from Egypt. This feast is still celebrated in Judaism today as Shavuot.

For the early Christian church, which based many celebrations upon their Jewish heritage, Pentecost became a feast commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ as described in the Acts of the Apostles.

For us as well as for the first disciples, the Spirit gives us power to be the people of God! The Spirit empowers us to live as Jesus lived and to love as Jesus loves. The Spirit inspires, leads, and guides us, weaving us together in unity as a family of faith. The Spirit empowers us to participate in God's mission in the world in the many and varied ways in which we have been called: healing, teaching, loving, sharing, caring, singing, giving...

Let's join together in heart and mind and spirit as together we are united in mission and on fire with the Holy Spirit of God!

Pentecost Special Offering will be received on Pentecost Sunday, June 9th. This offering helps our youth begin life with a strong foundation of faith formed in the first third of life, from childhood through young adulthood. Forty percent of the offering stays with our congregation to support a youth initiative of our own choosing. This year half of the money will go toward the 2020 mission trip and half will be used to replenish the Youth Triennium account. Twenty-five percent supports Young Adult Volunteers (YAV). Twenty-five percent supports ministries of youth. And ten percent supports Child Advocacy, “Educate a Child, Transform the World.”



Extreme need for supplies in Aqua Prieta by our mission partners at Frontera de Cristo has been brought to our attention by the Congregational Resource Committee of Presbytery. Migrants are flooding into the area to await a hearing to apply for asylum. Only five families a day are processed by authorities. In the meantime, the Catholic church there serves as a holding place for families who have nothing, and our mission workers are desperate to meet their basic needs. There will be collection boxes in the Church Office, Fellowship Hall and the Sanctuary from now through June 7th. The following list is on the website and will be an insert in the bulletin as well.


