A Message from the Campus Reopening Task Force

Dear FPC Friends,

Blessings to you all during these trying and uneasy times. As you know, Session has been actively working with everyone's health and safety at the forefront since the "shelter in place" order took effect. While the campus closure had immediate and sweeping impact, the staff acted quickly to begin online devotionals and Sunday worship. What a blessing these talented and hardworking individuals have been and continue to be, and the regular messages and weekly services have provided a beacon of reassurance and calm when things around us sometimes seem to be whirling out of control.

The Campus Reopening Task Force was appointed to develop a strategy and plan for when and how we might be able to return to our church campus and the fellowship and activities we all cherish and miss. We wanted to take this opportunity to communicate - to the best of our ability - our approach and what this will look like as we reenter our life together.

We have been blessed with a comprehensive and very well thought out set of guidelines from Presbytery framed around the CDC guidelines for the private sector, which have been reinterpreted for application to churches and congregations. The Task Force agreed our deliberations would be guided by these guidelines, and our discussions, examinations & assessments, and decision-making criteria have been and continue to be based on the wisdom of that document. We know the two big questions in everyone's minds are "When" and "How," and we hope to communicate as many answers to those questions as we can at this time.

WHEN?

The guidelines use a set of clear gating factors defined by the level to which the pandemic is being controlled, divided into three phases. Each phase is based on the foundation of Arizona having achieved a 14 consecutive day period of decline in the number of new cases of COVID-19. While the majority of our plans and preparations have been accomplished, we agree that we'll still need a one- to two-week readiness assessment period prior to beginning Phase One. Once the first goal of decline has been reached, our initial reopening date will be determined. Our ability to enter into Phases Two and Three respectively will be based on the next 14-day period of decline in new COVID-19 cases in the state.

HOW?

Phase One:

We want to be sure that our church is following all Presbytery and government health guidelines to protect the members of our congregation. With that in mind, we will begin reopening the campus with worship only: the sanctuary pews will be cleared; there will be no bulletins nor hymnals; and instead of passing offering plates, there will be clearly marked locations to continue to give your tithes and offerings. Masks will be required, and the congregation will be seated and dismissed by ushers using physical distancing guidelines. Seating in the sanctuary will be limited to 90 people, and family groups will be able to sit together. If more than 90 are in attendance, livestreaming

will be available in Fellowship Hall. Congregation members who are age 65 or above are considered at-risk and are encouraged to wait until Phase Three of reopening; however, if you are in the vulnerable category, you are strongly encouraged to consult with your doctor prior to making a decision to attend in-person worship. We will respect your ability to self-regulate your attendance.

One pleasant surprise coming out of all of this has been the positive response to our online worship services. The services you have been watching have been pre-recorded using a single iPhone on a tri-pod and then expertly edited by Gregg Gerlach. This will not be possible when live worship resumes. With no physical bulletins, hymnals or Bibles, alternative media will be required. It is for this reason that the Task Force and Worship Commission have solicited proposals for the necessary and appropriate video and audio equipment to provide the optimal experience as we enter this new interpretation of how to worship in these new times. These same means of providing you the order of worship, hymn lyrics and Scripture text in the sanctuary will also facilitate our ability to continue to provide an inviting and fulfilling online worship experience.

Phase Two:

Phase Two will be much the same as Phase One with worshippers still observing physical distancing and wearing masks, with limited reopening of certain portions of the campus. Groups outside of worship will be limited to groups of 10 to 49, but still observing physical distancing guidelines and wearing masks. Worship will remain virtually the same as in Phase One.

Phase Three:

Worship will resume with fewer restrictions space-wise, but with masks still recommended until a vaccine has been developed, is available and being widely administered.

The details of reopening are complex, and the safety of each congregation member continues to be of utmost importance. We know that God will continue to walk with us through these uneasy times, and we trust that we are using His wisdom as we seek to safely return to the church and friends that we love and to offer back to God our combined voices of prayer and praise.

Record temperatures and heat advisories are as much a part of Arizona summers as pool parties and barbecues. While we should all stay indoors between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., young, healthy minds and bodies need the stimulation of movement and play! First Things First, Arizona's early childhood agency, offers these tips to keep kids 5 and younger safe – and entertained – during the dog days of summer:

Bring the Play Inside

- Read stories, then let kids dress up and create their own tales. Many libraries offer story times, as well.
- Keep a list of activities you can suggest if kids become restless, like board games, craft projects, finger-painting and playing musical instruments.

Keep Kids Cool Outside

- Remind kids to drink something every 30 minutes or so. Water is best, but water-dense foods like fruit, yogurt, oatmeal, beans, and pasta are good, too.
- Choose the highest SPF sunscreen and apply on kids 30 minutes before sun exposure; re-apply often.
- Dress kids in lightweight cotton clothing that covers their arms and legs, plus sunglasses and hats.

Pool and Safety

- Keep kids within arm's reach, and don't assume anyone else is watching them.
- Install and maintain pool fences and gates.
- Search parks and community centers for free or reduced cost swim lessons.
- Never leave your child unattended in a vehicle.
- Always make sure all children have left the car when you reach your destination.


