Watch for another virtual choir on June 13th! The Sanctuary Choir will present the anthem "Shall We Gather at the River," arranged by Earlene Rentz. If you would like to be a part of the video, please let me know! You will need a computer to play audio and a phone/tablet to record video.

Last month, I mentioned to the choirs that writing "Happy Mother's Day" on the Choir Room whiteboard is one of the annual joys of my music ministry. Sadly, we've passed another year when that has not been possible to share with the choir. BUT, we are moving in the right direction! The Choir will rehearse in the Sanctuary periodically during the summer months and sing in worship the following Sundays. We will be masked, but at this point, we hope to resume a somewhat regular rehearsal and worship schedule in the fall. Please join us!

It bears repeating that singing in a choir may just make you healthier(!), according to a study by the University of California, Irvine: "Researchers at the school found increased levels of disease-

fighting proteins in the mouths of choir members after they sang Beethoven's choral masterwork, the *Missa Solemnis*. According to the study, a protein used by the immune system to fight disease, immunoglobulin A, increased 150 percent during rehearsals and 240 percent during performance. The boost seemed directly related to the singers' states of mind, which many participants described as happy



or euphoric. "The more passionate you feel while singing, the greater the effect," said Education Professor Robert Beck, who authored the study with Thomas Cesario, Dean of the university's College of Medicine. The difference in the increased levels between a performance and rehearsal, scientists theorized, may be because the singers had achieved mastery of the complicated piece after often-stressful rehearsals and were enjoying the thrill of the performance itself." 

SOLAR UPDATE

Thanks to your generosity we are soooo close to our goal of \$25,000!

As of last week slightly more than \$22,000 has been raised, funded by small, medium, and large contributions from 15 families. FPC continues to be blessed by a supportive congregation that steadfastly maintains this giving pattern over the years.

In anticipation of the next step I have been researching installation contractors. After reviewing some of your suggestions, and a myriad of ratings and reviews, I selected 10 worthy candidates and reached out for more information. After several companies reported that they didn't work in the east valley, didn't work on commercial installations, or only worked with APS or SRP not our provider, Mesa Electric Utility, this list was whittled down bit by bit.

The end result is about four companies with strong reputations and performance over the long-term. I am in the process of scheduling estimates from each one of them and hope to make a thoughtful selection by the end of this month.


