



Our capital campaign is on track with \$30,000 given or pledged so far. Thank you to the early givers who have come forward and supported this important project. Recall that the paving bid we have selected is \$250,000, with an option to add additional safety lighting for \$30,000 more.

A smooth, well-lit lot will make our church more presentable and add to the attractiveness of the neighborhood. Imagine the difference at the next community carnival this fall when we host it on a fresh new surface!



Here's where we can have a little fun. The lot holds about 200 cars and we have about 50 people in church on an average Sunday, which leaves 150 spaces for future visitors. I'm asking 150 people to give an extra \$1,000 which would be dedicated to a future visitor.
