A Message from Christian

For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard.

Yet God, in his grace, freely makes us right in his sight.

He did this through Christ Jesus when he freed us from the penalty for our sins.

— Romans 3:23-24 NLT

For a week in June I was the chaplain at Montlure Camp in Greer when we hosted the second group of junior highers. Based on the preselected curriculum chosen for the summer, each day we explored a different "link," such as love, grace, acceptance, being present, etc. Grace was one of the ones that the camp counselors were challenged to convey to the campers in their small groups.

I think part of the challenge is the age of the campers. It can be a challenging concept to wrap a 12 year old's mind around. I think the other challenge is that our sense of grace and gratitude needs to be grounded in our humility in the face of our own inadequacy and the amazing gift of redemption and new life we have in the Gospel. Put more simply, it is hard to appreciate the answer to the problem, when we don't know what the problem is in the first place.

I think Paul sensed the reality when he was writing to the Christians in Rome. Hence his Epistle to the Romans brought both realities together in the passage above. Doing so brings both foundational concepts into focus.

Our reformed style of worship tries to bring both of these facets together each week with the confession as well as the presentation of the Gospel in the sermon, hymns and songs, and more. That is all good and well for Sunday, but we need both on Monday, Tuesday, and everyday.

As we have officially crossed into summer, I encourage us all to keep reminding ourselves of these key concepts. There are a variety of ways to do this kind of thing. Keeping Scripture as a

part of our summer (and every season) reading helps. We have lots of examples of people facing their brokenness as well as experiencing the redemption we have in Jesus. My suggestion to the camp counselors was to read the Gospel according to Luke. He includes lots of people on the edges of communities that are acutely aware of these entwined realities. I invite you to join me in taking my own advice this summer and beyond.
