In its disrepair, the message to the neighborhood affirms their worst suspicions, that we are an older congregation, frail and falling apart, with diminished capacity to respond to the needs of our neighborhood.

I know that sounds a bit harsh, but that huge expanse of pavement  $\sim$  broken up and pot-holed  $\sim$  has been broadcasting a message about the church. It has been a paradigm of the fact that the church of the past is crumbling, and that message has sabotaged our public image and undermined our best marketing strategies.





Now, however, a freshly repaved and restriped lot sends out a different message, one that declares that we are relevant and vibrant, welcoming and inclusive, and that we are preparing for a bright and prosperous future! That message will do more to convince them of our saving purpose than all the promotions we can generate.

Having said that, however, it also needs to be said that even a repaved and restriped parking lot can send out an unintended message when it is empty on a Sunday morning. The time has come to fill the pews with faithfilled people even as the parking lot will receive the cars of all who come.

The message our new parking lot reveals is critical, and our great work now is to share the message of God's extravagant welcome and redeeming love to our neighbors! And I am certain that when they respond to our welcome, we will discover that a certain emptiness within has been filled, and that a quiet confidence in God's redeeming love has settled in for all that God intends to accomplish among us.

### Preschool



Things are moving along very nicely on many of our projects!

The interior painting project is now complete and looks so fresh and new! It was a good decision to take down the wallpaper. The teachers returned on July 24th to start to put everything back together again. It will be a lot of work but worth it. School starts back with kids on August 7th. Also, the painters finished ahead of schedule on the interior, so they started the exterior painting before their mid-August start date. They made a good start, and will be back to finish in early August.

After many attempts to get

shade for the playground over the large slab of concrete, it has finally come to fruition with the installation of a boxed 20ft+ Indian Laurel Fichus Tree. When Moon Valley Nursery brought, it they transplanted it into a much larger box. The environment already looks beautiful and will be able to grow into the bigger box that it is in now. They say that it can live in that box for at least 15 more years. In the future, the Church can decide if it wants to transport it to another location on the campus to have it planted into the ground as another option.

On July 19th the preschool refrigerator room (the room that has our refrigerator, hot water heater, washer/dryer and storage cabinets with the electrical access) got new tile, paint, appliances and storage cabinets. Part of this project included the removal of asbestos that was discovered in the bidding process. Because of this, the removal was done in mid-July, and it was contained without interrupting any of Head Start's class time with children.





Our teachers returned to the work on July 24th, and we have one new teacher who started that day too. The teachers will begin to empty out the storage which house all of our preschool equipment and new classroom resources that were part of the Quality First incentives

purchase. The classrooms had new countertops, sinks and faucets installed.

The new security fire doors for the hallways were installed, and they are exactly the way we wanted them to be. We are still waiting for the new office door to be installed, which should be any day now. We also anticipate that the

Security Access Control remote access system will be installed in August. That will further our efforts for safety and security. We are having a new metal sign made to be hung next to the entrance gate to indicate how to get into the Preschool/Head Start. We also purchased a "Knox Box" which gives the Fire Department access to this area as well. That will be installed with the sign once the Access Control System is installed. The print shop who is making the metal sign is also making window decals that will cover the windows to our hallways. They will be fun ocean themes that make it so that people cannot see inside the building. All of these things are a huge safety upgrade for the school, staff and families/students that we serve.





With all of these changes and getting ready for the new school year, we are working on updating our preschool website. This is also taking up some time to give it a much needed refresh. Little by little it is getting there! (:)

God is so good! Shiloh Murillo, Director The Church parking lot project wrapped up. The process included removing the entire parking surface area, resurfacing it and then paint striping it again. It looks wonderful!

At the beginning of July we purchased the new software program called ProCare. I am in the middle of the 10 hours of training videos now and hope to have some of it implemented for the start of the new school year. There is a pretty big learning curve, so it may have a slower roll out but it will be integrated over the next couple of weeks and months for sure.
