A Message from Ann

Discipleship: The Way of Jesus

The Great Commission given by Jesus and recorded in Matthew can be summed up as: “Go and make disciples!” As followers of Jesus, we are to become disciples and also make disciples – encourage discipleship in others whom God has put in our path. However, we need to first become clear about our own call to discipleship ~ what that means and how that takes shape in our lives ~ before we can effectively disciple others.

With that in mind, our focus this fall in both worship/preaching and in the Wednesday WRAP adult education study will be on discipleship. The sermon series will focus on the lives and actions of disciples: What Disciples Do. We will consider how disciples take their faith seriously, wrestle with God, resist greed, practice generosity, give thanks, and take their faith public! My hope is that this will help all of us grow deeper in our lives of discipleship and become better equipped to guide others to grow in their faith as well.

For Wednesday WRAP, we will use the Being Reformed: Faith Seeking Understanding curriculum of the PC(USA) which will be our guide as we consider the meaning and implications of living the lives of discipleship to which we have been called. Here is a brief excerpt from the participant’s booklet:

No word is more basic to the Christian vocabulary that “discipleship.” In many ways, however, it is a strange word, because discipleship makes unusual and unique demands on us. If I am a disciple, I must acknowledge the authority of a master or leader... If I am a disciple, I must commit myself to practicing a way of life that will deepen my distinctive identity as a follower of this master and as a member of this community.

Do we have any master greater than ourselves? Do we truly know to whom we belong? Do we/will we participate in a community that both encourages and corrects us to live more faithfully as followers of Jesus Christ?

These are important questions to ponder and pray about as together we delve deeper into discipleship, becoming the dynamic disciples God has created us to be! I am looking forward to worshipping, praying, and studying with you this fall!

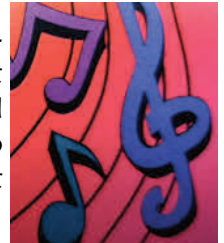

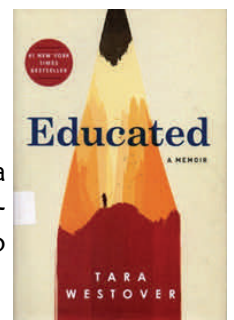
