May we all be gracious givers to our shared mission and ministry! ~Ann



We will also dedicate our new Glory to God hymnals and offer bookplates for the hymnals. Bookplates are offered for a donation of \$10 and may be given in honor or memory of a loved one. Donation information is included on the bookplate form.

The Hymns, Psalms, and Spiritual Songs hymnals served FPC for more than a quarter century! Last year, they were retired in favor of our new Glory to God hymnals, and we will give away our old hymnals on World Communion Sunday. Enjoy the wealth of hymnody and devotional resources! Congregation members may also pick up a copy of the hymnal in the Church Office, between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. weekdays excluding Fridays.

On World Communion Sunday 2020, we began campus reopening after seven months of onlineonly worship. Masks were required throughout the worship service, and hymns were only for listening! Twelve months later, we worship unmasked, we are able to sing with our masks on, and we are livestreaming worship services to our homes and to homes around the world. We share a renewed spirit of thanksgiving for one another and for the opportunities to gather together to worship our loving God. May He continue to bless our congregation as we seek to carry forward His love to future generations!


