A Message from David

Seasonal Change

One morning, in the autumn of the year, I was busy at work in my church office when I heard a man's voice explaining to my secretary that he was there to kidnap the pastor. Before I could process what was happening, he burst into my office and said, "Come on, you need to come with me." I said, "But I have work to do here."

Then this over-anxious parishioner forced me to prioritize my work by saying, "Tell me what you have to do today that is more important than photographing the changing leaves of autumn." I looked



at my list, put it in the drawer of my desk, got my camera and off we went on an amazing adventure.

I think back on that *kidnapping* about this time of year because I suspect that God put him up to it. I mean, there I was tending to the business of the Lord in the church, and he wanted to show me what God was up to in the world beyond the church ~ changing one season to another with a magnificent display of color.

We who live in the desert may not see a burst of color at seasonal change, but as a church, we are entering a season of change and it is every bit as beautiful. In response to Dr. Sean Chow's call for *Revitalization*, I have gathered information from our deacons and elders, and have identified what I'm calling *Thresholds of Adventure*. Some of them are internal in nature, but a couple of them will draw us out into the neighborhood to discover how we can be church to those who live within walking distance of our campus.

Once again it feels as though the familiar church routine is being interrupted by an invitation to go out and discover what God is doing to change one season of church life into another, and to appreciate that there is always extraordinary beauty in times of transition. We may not be able to photograph it, but we can enjoy the fresh air of new ideas and experience the thrill of adventure.

And maybe when we look back on this time in the life of the church, we will have the sense that it was God all along who was *kidnapping* us by His invitation: "Come with me, leave the familiar behind, and let me show you how beautiful life can be when you live beyond walls of familiarity."
