"The One whose throne is in heaven sits laughing." - Psalm 2:4

PW Circles in November will be delving into Lesson three in the study book "What My Grandmothers Taught Me; Learning from the Women in Matthew's Genealogy of Jesus" by Meryl Blair. Here we have another grandmother on Jesus' genealogy chart whose reputation is less than stellar. (Scripture in Joshua 2; 6:22-25) Rehab is locally considered a foreigner, who supports herself and her family as an inn keeper and prostitute. They appear to live in the ghetto area, the outskirts of the city that is most vulnerable to attack. This is where the spies, whom Joshua sent, stop to gather info. When the king orders Rahab to give up these men, she does not let fear affect her faith in God. She ignores the king's orders and hides the spies. Her wit and presence of mind allowed God's plans to come to fruition. "By faith the prostitute Rahab, because she welcomed the spies, was not killed with those who were disobedience" (Hebrews 11:31). She cuts loose from all the restrictions placed on her by social position, economic constraints, gender and race, and calls us to look more carefully for God's presence around us and within us (pg. 34). Please join us by attending one of our four Circles to learn more about these awe-inspiring women in Jesus' family tree.

Another purpose of PW is our support of the mission of the church worldwide and work for justice and peace. Most of this is accomplished through contributions to a variety of mission projects. Our funds come from member pledges and our one fundraiser which will be held in a few weeks. 


