Advent with the Prophets

This Sunday we will enter the season of Advent, that sacred space of anticipation and expectant waiting. We wait... knowing what will arrive. We wait... hoping that our hearts will be tenderly touched. We wait... praying peace will ultimately prevail on earth. We wait... almost not believing that joy is still possible. We wait... for love to be born into the world again!

Advent wreaths can help us in our waiting, giving us a ritual to mark the time and candles to light the way. I encourage you to find or make an advent wreath for use in your home this season. It can be something very simple constructed of modeling clay and birthday candles (google 99 cent advent wreath) or something more elaborate. Use materials you have around the house and get creative! Traditional purple candles are great, but any color will do. White tea lights, votives, or tapers will all create a beautiful and holy glow.

You can light one candle each Sunday or re-light the same candle every day of the week. Read a Scripture passage, offer a prayer, or talk about what waiting for Christmas means to you. Another idea is to use an Advent devotional to guide your prayer and candle lighting time.

Music Sunday will be celebrated on December 20th at 10:00 a.m. Though we can't yet sing but quietly beneath our masks, we will celebrate the birth of our Savior with virtual music from our women's trio Heavenly Harmonies and from combined singers of the Sanctuary Choir and One Voice. We'll also share in Christmas readings, live handbell music, the HolyGrounds praise band, Hearts, Hands & Voices, a piano/organ duet, soloist, and virtual carols!

On Christmas Eve, we'll gather to celebrate the birth of Jesus in a very unique way. We'll have one service, an outdoor service at 5:00 p.m. Ushered Parking will begin at 4:30, and we'll view our service and activities on a large screen. With a hay wagon chancel and a parking lot Sanctuary, the service will be broadcast to our car radios! We'll hear the Christmas message, the music of the HolyGrounds praise band, handbells, and a virtual children's pageant. Very festive indeed!

Poinsettias are being displayed in our Sanctuary during the Advent season; however, with Covid-19 safety concerns and to avoid the passing of paper forms and plants, we have made a couple of changes. We will be using only silk poinsettias this season. You are invited to order a silk poinsettia, and they are \$10 apiece. Please use this <u>FORM</u> for each poinsettia ordered, and send a check to the church (payable to "First Presbyterian Church," with memo notation "Poinsettias") or contribute via our <u>online giving</u>, using the category "Worship Supplies/Decorations." Your poinsettia(s) may be left with the church to be reused each year or may be taken following our Epiphany Sunday service, January 3rd. The deadline for orders is December 14th.

Our FPC Artist Series will present the Fabulous Blackwood Quartet during worship on Sunday, February 14th, at 10:00 a.m. The Blackwood Brothers Quartet was formed in 1934 with brothers Roy, Doyle, James and Roy's son, R.W. In the late 50s, Roy and Doyle retired from traveling, and in 1954, R.W.



was killed in a tragic airplane crash. However the quartet with James, as the quartet's leader and spokesman, established a new group of singers who would go on to take Gospel music to new heights as they traveled and sang in all fifty of the United States, every Canadian province as well as cities in Great Britain, Europe, the Middle East, Northern Africa, South Africa, Japan, Taiwan, Thailand, South Korea, Hong Kong and the Philippines. In 2002, James Blackwood went to be with the Lord, but his sons, Jimmy (James Jr.) and Billy continued the 80-year tradition. Recently, Jimmy retired after singing for 49 years, and his younger brother,

Billy, now carries on the quartet which has the distinction of being the best-known name in Gospel Music history! Join us online and in-person on February 14th as the Fabulous Blackwood Quartet leads us in worship.
