The Gospel According to Scrooge will be presented in our Sanctuary on Sunday, December 12th, at 2:00 p.m. It will feature Dr. Glenn Bennett as Jacob Marley! The performance is produced by Galen Gallegos of Theatrical Ministries Inc. and is offered free of charge as a gift from our Church Artist Series Patrons. Please note that the performance will include unmasked singing and will be presented to a potentially larger group than we currently have in worship. To address these issues, every other pew will remain cordoned off, so there will be added

space between audience rows. The audience will also be invited to remain masked and will not sing. We pray that we will be offering a safe environment for all to enjoy the performance, but if the setting remains of concern, please watch our Sunday services for information regarding a limited number of performance recordings. Livestreaming of the concert will not be available.

Join us for Music Sunday: "Celebrate the Day!" Our choirs will present their annual music celebration on Sunday, December 19th, as a part of our 10:00 a.m. worship service. The Sanctuary Choir and One Voice will combine for virtual anthems, and we will have live music from Hearts Hands and Voices, Dei Gloriam Handbell Choir, First Ringers, and the HolyGrounds Praise Band.




