# Announcements

The fifth annual FPC "Worship in the Park" will be held on Palm Sunday, March 24th. We'll meet at Red Mountain Park (7745 E. Brown Rd.) at 10:00 a.m. for a picnic, games, and worship led by Pastor Brant, the Praise Band, One Voice, and Hearts Hands and Voices. The park includes ball fields, playgrounds, basketball, a walking trail, soccer, and volleyball. We will meet at the "Dove" Ramada. The link to the park ramada map is shown in Brant's message on the first page of this issue. Hard copies of the maps will be available during our Sunday worship services on March 17th or in the Church Office.

Dale Wood's "A Service of Darkness" will be offered in the Sanctuary on Maundy Thursday, March 28th, at 7:00 p.m. The Sanctuary Choir will be joined by Cantilena with Director Dr. Glenn Bennett. "A Service of Darkness" is patterned after the ancient service of *Tenebrae*. Seven choral meditations are based on the seven last words of Jesus from the cross. With each meditation, light will be progressively extinguished until only a candle sheds its glow as a symbol of the coming Resurrection.

Easter Sunday, March 31st, will begin with a Sunrise Service on the Sanctuary Patio, at 6:00 a.m. Following the service, we'll move to Fellowship Hall for breakfast. At 9:00 we'll meet again for a Festival Worship Service, with special music offered by our choirs, organ, and piano. The morning will conclude with another Easter celebration in our HolyGrounds CoffeeHouse at 11:30 a.m. in Fellowship Hall. "Our Lord Is Risen, Indeed!"


