## A Message from Brant

Back in the fall I preached about the importance of remembering FPC in your estate planning. A tithe, or more, on your estate is like seed that is scattered, and grows despite what we do or don't do, in ways we don't pretend to know or understand, first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head, and then it is ripe and ready for harvest.

You can do great good for the Kingdom of God, and for the church you love, by the simple stroke of a pen, but only if you decide to do it and take the necessary steps. Maybe you assign the church a portion of your estate through your will, as Karen and I have done, allocating 5% of our estate, such as it may be, to each of the churches we have served in ministry so far. Or maybe you name the church as the beneficiary for your life insurance. Or maybe you explore something like a charitable remainder trust, which provides an income for you until your death, and then gives the principle to the church or charity of your choosing.

I repeated these thoughts in February at the Annual Congregational Meeting, and again in worship a short time after that, when the Session announced the newly created Worship Arts Endowment Fund.

### So here's my question: have you done anything about it yet?

As good as your intentions might be, this is something that only you can do, and it probably starts with you making an appointment with your lawyer or financial advisor.

Direct bequests have helped FPC mightily over the past several years with debt reduction and capital improvements. And over the past five years our various Endowment Funds, though small, have been able to accomplish meaningful things. Here are just a few highlights:

- ◆ The Montlure Fund has helped scores of young people get to summer camp, with total disbursements usually around \$1000 per year;
- ◆ The Bertha Young Fund (for Christian Education) has paid for training material for the Befrienders and sent members for training at various workshops;
- ◆ The Stubblefield and Kissinger Funds (for training in ministry) have helped Luke Parker and, more recently, Lois Hildenbrand, while the Kissinger and Melhop Fund for education also helped send Jasmine Couillard and Kirk Sexton for LOGOS training;
- ◆ The Theilmann Fund (to be spent at the discretion of Session) has paid for web site expenses related to the Mesa Prayer Walk.

Catch the vision, then make the call and accomplish what your heart purposes for remembering your church as part of your final affairs. And may God bless you as you do so!


