A Message from Brant

In a book written about the Apostle Paul in 1983 there are three references in the index to the terms “truth, ultimate.” But readers looking at pages 30, 32, and 470 find that they are blank. Is it just a good-natured spoof, or is it a statement challenging our ability to ever know ultimate reality? (E.P. Sanders *Paul and Palestinian Judaism*, Philadelphia: Fortress Press, 1983.)

There is an important word that appears two dozen times in the New Testament, the Greek word *dokimazein*, which means “to make a critical examination,” “to put to the test,” to determine the genuineness of something.” Pastor Jim Edwards says that “Christians have often avoided this commandment because they have confused a critical attitude with an uncharitable attitude. Uncharitability is an offense against love, but uncriticalness is an offense against truth. Put to the test all things, then hold to what is good” (Jim Edwards, the Edwards Epistle Vol XIX, No 1&2).

In order that we may “make critical examination,” we are kicking off our most ambitious all-church study to date: The Truth Project. Focus on the Family is designed to help Christians look at their worldview—that set of assumptions we all carry with us at a more or less unconscious level, but which guide us in the most powerful and profound ways. How do we know and evaluate truth claims? How do we sort through varied value systems? What are the core things that guide us? We owe it to ourselves and to those around us to be clear about these powerful, fundamental things. Over twelve weeks (!) we’ll go through topics like theology, philosophy, science, and even politics (!!) examining our closely-held assumptions and making sure they measure up to the Word of God.

The Bible calls us to “make critical examination” that we might know the Truth.

Please know that this study will require a bit more from us: the DVD teaching videos are about 55 minutes long, to be followed by 40-45 minutes of guided interactive discussion. Your small group or Sunday School class may have to negotiate a bit to make sure that everyone is going to the same worship service (before or after), has childcare, or whatever. In the end the investment of an extra 30 minutes or so each week will be well worth it! As always, for those not in a small group, the Y’All Come Class will be meeting in the Sanctuary.

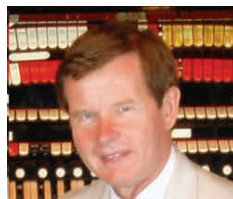

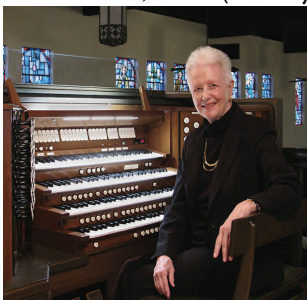

DOROTHY REISS - “Dr. Dorothy” started piano with her mother at age four and won her first competition at seven. The summer of her 16th year she took some organ lessons to become high school organist and had her own radio show of pop tunes on KTOW, Oklahoma City. At the University of Oklahoma she became a protégé of the legendary Mildred Andrews and won many competitions including the American Guild of Organists National in San Francisco, 1952, at age 20. The death of her beloved father from complications of diabetes changed her life resulting in a decision to become a Doctor. She was awarded a Doctor of Medicine degree in 1969. Four years of post-grad study qualified her to practice Internal Medicine which she continued in Pasadena until retirement in 2000! After relocating to Las Vegas she resumed organ playing (some 50 years later!) and serves as Associate

Organist at First Christian Church, Las Vegas. She performed her 75th birthday concert at the University of Nevada Las Vegas in 2006, her 77th at First Christian Church Las Vegas in 2009, and her 80th at UNLV in 2011. She was featured artist for the American Guild of Organists Region IX Convention in San Francisco, July 2011, performing at First Congregational Church, Berkeley, the same venue as her winner's recital in 1952!

San Carlos Apache Reservation Mission Trip

We are returning this year to the San Carlos Apache Indian Reservation, to work with mission partners Amor Ministries in building homes. The median annual household income on the reservation is approximately \$14,000 which means about 77% of the people live under the poverty line, and there are approximately 2400 families on the Reservation in need of homes. Thirty nine percent of families live in substandard housing and 40% of the families live in overcrowded conditions. For many, cramped quarters, un-safe living conditions and poverty contribute to a vicious cycle where "home" is not a safe place to reside. The need for adequate housing is urgent.



FPC has arranged to work with Amor Ministries, a well-known home building mission partner in the southwest. Of course building a house is only part of the work: we hope to open hearts to truly see the grace and love of Jesus through providing tangible objects of security, safety, and stability.

The process to build a 28' x 24' home has many steps, and we may not know until we get there if we'll be doing concrete work, painting, or other things. Most of the work is moderately physical, although there are some jobs that are less so.

Once more the cost will be under \$300 (including building materials, hotel, and food). Each participant is asked to cover at least one third of their own costs, the church (through the Missions budget) will cover one third for church members, and each participant is asked to find "mission partners" who will agree to sponsor them (for whatever amount, but totaling the remaining one third) in exchange for a report on the project (and as a way to engage friends and family in what we are doing!).

We'll leave at 6:30 a.m. on Saturday, October 12th, returning Sunday, October 31st, around 6:00 p.m. For more information, contact Phill Pagels, Elder for Mission, (480) 427-7254. This is a great trip for families, youth, & seniors!

Operation Christmas Child Shoe Box Ministry

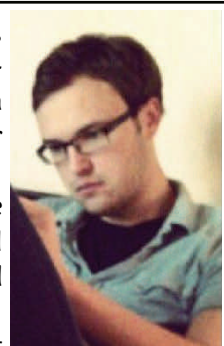

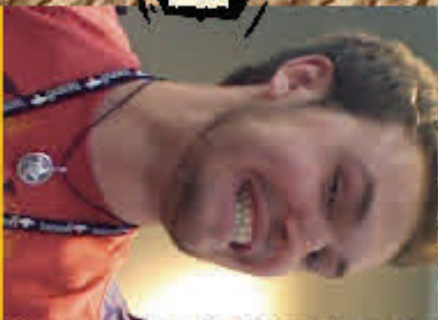
