A Message from Brant

October means many things to many folk, but for FPC it means MISSION!

Once more we'll be taking a group down to the San Carlos Apache Reservation to build houses in what can only be called "another world." The extremes of poverty we witness as we work and move about the area are heartbreaking, and the stats are even more so: the median annual household income on the reservation is approximately \$14,000 which means about 77% of the people live under the poverty line, and there are approximately 2400 families on the reservation in need of homes. Thirty nine percent of families live in sub-standard housing and 40% of the families live in overcrowded conditions. For many, cramped quarters, un-safe living conditions and poverty contribute to a vicious cycle where "home" is not a safe place to reside. The need for adequate housing is urgent and we're glad we can be a part of meeting it. The group that goes out of FPC is always quite mixed in terms of age, skill, and ability. Never fear, there's always something for everyone to do. **What is needed most if for you to sign up!** I promise it will be an experience that will grow you spiritually and connect you with others in new and deep ways (see the Mission page for more information).



But wait, there's more! On Saturday, October 26th, we have the opportunity to join with the entire city of Mesa for Make A Difference Day, working on a project to help beautify and improve our city (time and place to be determined). In years past we've cleaned up alleyways and washed trucks for United Food Bank. If you know of any projects in your neighborhood, please let mission elder Phill Pagels know as we might be interested in taking it on. No matter what we do it's bound to be a wonderful morning of taking the love of Christ out of the church and into the city!

And of course around all of this goes the ongoing work of ministry: choirs, Sunday School classes, the food pantry, I-HELP, Befrienders, WNL, Mesa Presbyterian Ministries, Scouting, and so much more. Thanks for all the ways you continue to answer God's call to joyous and faithful service, which is part of our worship of giving thanks for all God has done in our lives and the many blessings we've received!

San Carlos Reservation mission trip

Our mission trip to San Carlos is just around the corner (October 12-13). Once more we'll be working under the guidance of Amor Ministries, a well-known home building mission partner in the southwest. Of course building a house is only part of the work: we hope to open hearts to truly see the grace and love of Jesus through providing tangible objects of security, safety, and stability.

The process to build a 28' x 24' home has many steps, and we may not know until we get there if we'll be doing concrete work, painting, or other things. Most of the work is moderately physical although there are some jobs that are less so.

Once more the cost will be under \$300 (including building materials, hotel, and food). Each participant is asked to cover at least one third of their own costs, the church (through the Missions budget) will cover one third for church members, and each participant is asked to find "mission partners" who will agree to sponsor them (for whatever amount, but totaling the remaining one third) in exchange for a report on the project (and as a way to engage friends and family in what we are doing!)

We'll leave at 6:30 a.m. on Saturday, October 12th, returning Sunday, October 13th, by around 6:00 p.m. For more information about this trip OR Mesa Make A Difference Day, please contact Phill Pagels, Elder for Mission, (480) 427-7254.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Our small group is once again inviting all interested to join with us in providing Christmas Shoeboxes to the needy children of the world. In 1993 Franklin Graham's Samaritan's Purse launched the Operation Christmas Child program. The first year of the program 28,000 boxes were collected. Since then over 80 million gift-filled boxes have been distributed to children in over 130 nations. This will be our 6th year collecting boxes. Last year we reached our goal of 75 boxes and would really like to exceed that amount this year. Would you please help us reach this goal?

We are hoping to have boxes available the end of October or use an empty shoe box (standard size). Filling the box is a very simple task. You need to decide if you will be gifting a boy or girl using one of these age categories: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Gift ideas are: toys, school supplies, hygiene items, hard candy or lollipops (double bagged), socks, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), t-shirt, caps, etc.

We are asking that the shoe box be returned to the church on November 17th as we need to deliver them to the collection point between November 18th and 25th.
