A Message from Brant

It's that time of year when we transform *La Palabra* into an Annual Report covering everything that has gone on this past year. There are so many people doing so many things that it's easy to lose track, but this report has it all in one place. As I've said before, this is one busy church!

One of the defining events of 2013 was the "electrical incident" that required us to move out of the sanctuary for the better part of five months. It was amazing to see how quickly the Session and staff responded, and how flexible we all were willing to become, in response. At the end of the day, we were never able to figure out what caused the problem—aging equipment seems mostly likely—and the damage was remarkably isolated considering what could have been the case (God was watching over us to be sure!). Despite various unexpected developments and delays we ended up in many ways better off (new fixtures and equipment), and only had to pay our \$1,000 deductible!

That being said, another problem came to light in all this having to do with our primary electrical service. Rest assured we will be taking steps this spring to remedy this issue, which happily fits together nicely with the final completion of the Fellowship Hall Extreme Make Over. To this end the church will be entirely shut down for the week of March 17th-21st (spring break for Mesa Public Schools). Thanks in advance for your patience and prayers during this time (and thanks for your continued faithful stewardship to help pay for these expenses)!

In and around all that excitement, we continued to bring our God vibrant worship (meeting in Fellowship Hall had its advantages!), do mission in the name of Christ (I-HELP, Mesa Presbyterian Ministries, the Food Cupboard, and many more all continue apace) and grow in our faith (the Truth Project was a major focus of our efforts through the fall and has blessed everyone who took part). As we head into 2014 ex-

pect more of the same, especially as our Acts 16:5 Visioning Team meets in earnest and works with the Session toward plans and programs to keep FPC strong and vital for years to come.

The Annual Congregational meeting will be on Sunday, February 9th, starting at 5:00 p.m. with a pot luck supper in Fellowship Hall. Please bring your potluck according to this schedule: Last name beginning with A-F Salad, G - L Dessert, M-R Side dish, and S - Z Main Dish. We have very little business to take care of, but a lot of fun to attend to, as we reveal **brand new chairs** for Fellowship Hall and auction off our old ones. Come prepared to bid!!



Most of our efforts this year have been on maximizing our online presence. We have also been trying to do more with Facebook as a way of getting the word out about FPC. The best evangelism, however, happens as we invite our friends and neighbors!

Assimilation

The Assimilation Deacon is responsible to contact second time visitors to our church. Phone calls welcome them to our church and answer questions. I also watch for new faces in the congregation on Sunday morning and try to welcome them to our church family. The other responsibility is assisting with the new member class, telephoning the list of potential attenders reminding them about the class.

Seasonal Ministries

Blood drive: The April blood drive had 21 appointments but there were 6 no-shows and 1 walk-in. Of the total of 16 who stepped up to give blood there were 13 successful draws. For the November blood drive we moved our partnership to the American Red Cross. Thirty three donors registered. Thirty one blood products were successfully collected. Having the Blood Drive Unit close to Fellowship Hall for those donating and for the congregational support of those giving made a difference.

Angel Tree: We sponsored three neighborhood families this year. Once again, as is a tradition of FPC, we provided gifts to each of family members, as well as a holiday meal, other food stuffs, and an assortment of household and personal items.

Labauch Literacy

Over 57 served as tutors this past year, giving over 2,500 hours of service. Tutors and support staff spent another 2,600 hours driving, training, and tracking tutors. We had have served 91 students from primarily Asian and Hispanic backgrounds. Once more, two students became U.S. citizens, and three conversations classes helped many others learn how to interact with people of another culture. All in all, a very productive year! The support of FPC is greatly appreciated.

Mesa Presbyterian Ministries

Mesa Presbyterian Ministries (MPM) had a busy year in 2013. The total number of calls when the MPM phone line was open continues to exceed 500, with about 1/3 of those receiving assistance of some sort: utilities, rent, food, meals, medical, transportation, and other miscellaneous items.

Deacon's Food Cupboard

The Food Cupboard continues to have high demand, with approximately 60 bags being given out each week. If each of these 3000 bags goes to a family of four, there is an impact of 12,000 people served, and an estimated dollar value of nearly \$120,000!

The Ministry Commission is the "business arm" of the church. It oversees Property and Grounds, Stewardship, the Finance (and Endowment) committees, Personnel, Nominating and Session.

Property

2013 was a year drastically different from any other we have ever experienced! Ever since the fire last spring, the majority of our time and effort was devoted to working with contractors, suppliers and insurance adjusters to get the Sanctuary back up and running in a timely fashion. As a result of the fire, there were numerous items discovered (though not directly related to the cause) which had to be addressed before we could get approval to re-occupy the Sanctuary. While the insurance settlement was very fair, there were <u>extra</u> costs for material and labor that we incurred to bring the campus into compliance with current building codes. We did our best to exercise extreme fiscal responsibility, especially until such time as our insurance claim was resolved.

There was a new A/C unit installed in the kitchen area but other than that, most everything else was normal maintenance and absolutely necessary repairs. Major repairs were in the kitchen for the freezer and the fire suppression system. We also experienced a sizeable water leak in the Preschool area that required an additional unanticipated expenditure.

My utmost appreciation goes to our Building Manager, Don Krill. Without Don's expertise and diligence, 2013 would not have turned out nearly as well as it did. Thank you, Don!

Stewardship and Finance

The Finance Committee consists of Stewardship Elder and Church Treasurer David Frederick; Property Elder Sam Thielke; Endowment Chair Jack Gunter; Ex-officio Finance Chair Jim Schwartzmann, and at-large members Brent Gregory, Mary Jane Hee and Jan Montgomery. The committee meets monthly to review the church's financial reports and took the following actions in 2013:

- Proceeds from the sale of a donated vehicle (\$4,000) were used to pay down church debt.
- Tracked expenses involved in electrical system damage.
- David Frederick spoke to the congregation with an update on the Fellowship Hall makeover projects. Thanks to everyone's faithful giving, there is enough money on hand to move the electrical transformer and install a patio space. This will be completed in 2014.
- Recommended to the Session reducing church debt and increasing capital reserve balance, which was approved.

Endowment

The Endowment Committee consists of Jack Gunter, Brent Gregory, Mary Jane Hee, Jim Schwartzmann and Skeets Throckmorton, with David Frederick, Stewardship Elder, serving as an ex-officio member. The committee met four times during 2013 and has undertaken the following actions:

- Continued oversight of the Endowment Funds including the Kissinger, Mehlhop, Stubblefield and Montlure Funds with a total value of \$97,998.17 as of December 31, 2013. In addition, the General Endowment Fund value as of December 31 was \$100,894.87 and the Capital Endowment Fund value as of December 31 was \$36,177.03.
- Disbursed \$1,381 of the Montlure Fund income for camp scholarships, disbursed \$204 of the Stubblefield Fund income for a Teaching Elder credential fee and \$565 for a Seminary scholarship, disbursed \$250 of the Kissinger Fund income to Frontiers, \$250 to Oasis Micro Finance, \$600 for the FPC mission trip, \$500 for a seminary scholarship and disbursed \$600 of the Mehlhop Fund income for a Grief Support class.
- Continued to interpret the endowment concept to the congregation in conjunction with an Endowment Fund brochure, Minutes for Mission and Fall Endowment luncheon and brunch presentations, conveying the need for further contributions to the Endowment Fund.
- Received \$1,000 to establish a Music Endowment Fund. The value of the fund as of December 31, 2013, was \$1,005.13.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN



Presbyterian women weave an indelible thread through the fabric of FPC both mission-wise and fellowship-wise. In addition to supporting churchwide missions through PW of the Presbytery (Thank Offering, Birthday Offering, Least Coin Offering and the General Churchwide Mission fund), PWFPC supports regional missions (Montlure Camp, Menaul School), local community missions (New Leaf Autumn House, Child Crisis Center, Salvation Army, Laubach Literacy, FPC

Preschool), and missions within FPC (Kitchen memorial fund, Sewing Circle that provides lap quilts and prayer shawls to the infirm). PW collected household items for people who lost homes in the devastating Yarnell Fire. And Eve Circle has pledged specific support for the international mission "Change of Hope." PW's financial base comes through yearly pledges and an annual bake sale conducted during the fall Craft Fair.

Members of PWFPC serve on regional boards. Susan McMichael is treasurer of PW Synod of the Southwest. Helen Lents is treasurer of PW Presbytery of Grand Canyon. Flinn Lund, an active member of Church Women United, keeps us connected with a community-wide association of Christian women.

Through Jeannette Laurie, liaison to the fellowship commission, PW assists with church dinners and craft fairs, as well as other social functions. PW served a continental breakfast for members of Presbytery at the meeting where Bob Schultz was installed as Moderator of Presbytery of Grand Canyon. Other PW sponsored social events have included spring and holiday luncheons where we invited PW groups from neighboring churches to join us.

PW plans and presents a worship service for Women's Sunday, an annual March event. In 2013 Lois Hildenbrand, gave the Woman's Sunday sermon. During the service she was presented with the PW Honorary Life Member Award for outstanding service to the church.

As part of a larger network of Presbyterian Women nationwide, PW Circles use the Horizons Study Guide, An Abiding Hope, The Presence of God in Exodus and Deuteronomy for the basis of their 2013-14 Bible study. Four Circles meet monthly October-May and welcome new members:



We have over 30 adult volunteers, participating weekly or monthly! 
Vacation Bible School amongst other duties) since June of 2012!

Vacation Bible School 2013 was SonWest Roundup. Patty Carnes was the assistant director, and we registered 46 children, age 3 -12, to attend Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. VBS had 45 adult and youth volunteers help with all the children! Vacation Bible School 2014 is already in the planning stages. The theme will be Son-Treasure Island and will be held *in the evening* from June 16 - June 23.

Bibles were presented to children in 7th grade, 3rd grade and kindergarten, as well as to children (and adults) that didn't own a Bible. We placed 13 new Bibles into needing hands this year.

Montlure Presbyterian Camp was held in Tuscon, Arizona at Mt. Lemmon in summer of 2013. Thirteen of our church children attended, and we were able to sponsor them with \$1,481 in scholarship funds!

We truly feel blessed at our preschool as we look back at what 2013 has given us! There have been many new things happening that are bringing new families from the community to join us. We are pleased to announce that we had all 9 of the staff return for another year. A special note of celebration for Nicki McInelly for starting her 10th year here at First Presbyterian Preschool! She and all of the staff are highly qualified individuals who bring skill and expertise to the everyday experiences of the children we serve.

A huge Thank You goes out to all of the church staff for supporting the efforts be-



hind the scenes. This really makes a big difference to keep the operation of the preschool going. We



have had a beautiful partnership with Pastor Brant Baker and Dr. Mark Ramsey this past year during our weekly chapel time with the families. They have encouraged the children to grow in their faith and love of God. There are many families who join us as we worship each week.

Our facility is licensed through the State Department of Health Services to provide services for 59 children. The 2012-13 school year ended with 51 children enrolled and 29 of those kids went on to Kindergarten in August 2013! We also are a Department of Economic Security certified site which means that we are able to support those families in the community who are receiving services for childcare coverage so that they can work or go to school. We have three

children utilizing the DES childcare program.

We are still receiving the benefits of participating in the First Things First Quality First scholarship program. There was a change from last year's participation to this year. We still participate in our bi-monthly coaching services that we receive from Southwest Human Development. Our coach comes in to help support the work of our teaching staff by providing quality resources, support and trainings for the entire center. The difference that has occurred is that we no longer receive the FTF Preschool grant, but instead they increased the scholarships that they have allotted to our preschool for the Quality First Childcare grant. We now receive 18 full-time slots that can be used for 18 students or we can split them and provide some scholarship assistance to up to 36 children. We are currently using some of them for full-time and some for parttime scholarships for the students. These funds equal a total income of





\$108,000.

Participating in the QF childcare program has increased our presence in the community. Because of our participation, we are automatically added to the azftfscholarship.org website where individuals can search from providers within their zip code. It is a powerful tool for us at no cost! We are anticipating the new assessment cycle to begin in the next two months that re-qualifies us to participate for the next school year. As soon as that is complete, they will let us know what our allotted scholarships will be for the coming year.

There have been a few physical changes around the preschool as well. We were able to replace all of the countertops in each classroom and replace some of the cabinet doors that needed updating. This has modernized the classes to look more professional and welcoming to the families.

We also completed a total remodel of the Preschool Office this last summer. It has been repainted and new shelves have been added to make the professional resources more accessible to the staff as they develop their lesson plans. These changes are welcoming and engaging for the students, families and teaching staff.

As we look forward to 2014, we are working on partnering with the church to budget for a total remodel of the playground bathrooms. This would mean replacing the toilets, countertops, sinks, paint and partitions. We are asking for your prayers and financial support to make this possible in the next school year. We appreciate all of your love and continuing to make the Preschool a ministry of the church. We are very blessed and know that God has so much in store for these children, families and the staff that work with them.


