## *A Message from Brant*

As part of our Acts 16:5 Initiative (a vision seeking and church vitality program), the Session of FPC has invited all of us to a 7/77 adventure in prayer—seven minutes a day for 77 days—with the goals of igniting our passion for God, and lifting before the throne of grace the life and ministry we share as a church.

I was given the task of writing a daily prayer guide for this adventure, and what a blessing it was to do so. These prayer guides will be available for you to pick up (one per family should be fine unless you have sharing issues) on Sunday, August 31st, and Sunday, September 7th, with Day 1 being Monday, September 8, 2014 (the Guides will also be available anytime in the church office). A \$5 donation is requested but not required. OR, if you prefer, you can purchase the Guide on your Kindle for only 0.99!

The prayer guide is pretty simple to use. You simply keep it in a place you know you will get to every day, such as the breakfast table, your office desk, or at your bedside. Plan on about seven minutes a day to read the meditations and pray as suggested. Finally, and most importantly, don't get defeated and give up. Better to pray 73 days, or 64, or 52, or 21, or even 8...than not at all.

Friends, we are a community, and we are a community who together need to seek God's leading and direction for our life in the coming years. Won't you please commit to give just seven minutes each day to this vital work? I promise that God will bless you in the process!

I would like to thank our church Personnel Committee and Session for offering me a time of sabbatical this summer. The study portion of the time away was used to practice the complete organ works of American composer Vincent Persichetti (1915-87). Persichetti was also the focus of my doctoral dissertation, and while I had analyzed his organ music, I had performed only a few of the pieces. 2015 will mark the 100th anniversary of the composer's birth and the beginning of our Visser-Rowland's 25th year, so I hope to complete a Persichetti recording next year. On a side “note,” I am very grateful to Mary Jane and John Hee, Brant Baker and Dan Reeves for painting my office this summer as part of an “extreme office makeover” spearheaded by several choir members. Thank you one and all! I greatly appreciated the time of sabbatical renewal and study, and I am very proud of the “new” office!

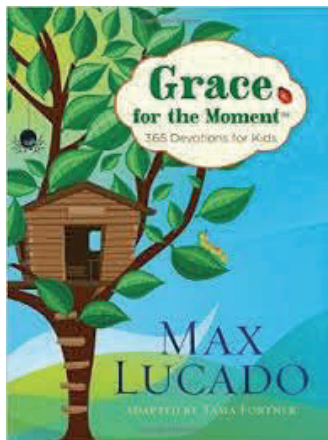

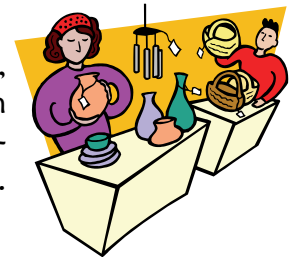

### *Just for Laughs...in honor of Brant's sermon series:*

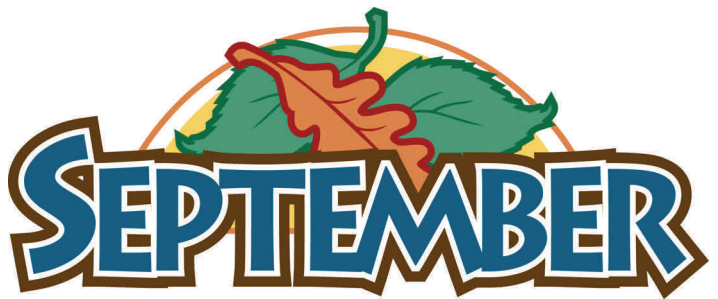
