A Message from Brant

In April our faith is renewed and recharged with the glories of Easter. Along the way we pass through Holy Week, and particularly Maundy Thursday (April 17th). The Sanctuary Choir will once more partner with the Sun Valley Choral and the Sun Valley Community Church Choir to present DuBois' "Seven Last Words." The service will include an observance of the Lord's Supper.

On Easter Sunday (April 20th), we will again have three services: 6:00 a.m. Sunrise Service (followed by a pancake breakfast), and then 9:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. Each service will feature the same sermon but will have different musical elements, as we celebrate our Lord's resurrection and the new life we have in Him!

In his book *Mortal Lessons, Notes on the Art of Surgery*, Dr. Richard Selzer, a retired faculty member of the Yale University School of Medicine shares this story of new life out of sorrow:

I stand by the bed where a young woman lies, her face postoperative, her mouth twisted in palsy, clownish. A tiny twig of the facial nerve, the one to the muscles of her mouth, has been severed. She will be thus from now on. I as a surgeon have followed with religious fervor the curve of her flesh; I promise you that. Nevertheless, to remove the tumor in her cheek, I had to cut the little nerve.

Her young husband is in the room. He stands on the opposite side of the bed, and together they seem to dwell in the evening lamplight, isolated from me, private. Who are they, I ask myself, he and this wry-mouth I have made, who gaze at and touch each other so generously, so greedily?

The young woman speaks. 'Will my mouth always be like this?' she asks.

'Yes,' I say, 'it will. It's because the nerve was cut.'

She nods, and is silent. But the young man smiles. 'I like it,' he says, 'it's kind of cute.'

All at once I know who he is. I understand, and I lower my gaze. One is not bold in an encounter with one so filled with God. Unmindful, he bends to kiss her crooked mouth, and I so close I can see how he twists his own lips to accommodate to hers, to show her that their kiss still works. I remember that God did once appear in human flesh as mortal, living and dying that such might be possible, and I hold my breath at the wonder of the resurrection.


