Announcements

The FPC Sanctuary was dedicated during a special worship service on Sunday, December 13, 1964. We have enjoyed a year-long series of concerts in our Sanctuary to commemorate the anniversary, and on Sunday, December 7th, the celebration will culminate with a 9:00 a.m. worship-recital featuring Dr. Dorothy Young Riess on our great organ and the sharing of hymns and readings drawn from the Sanctuary dedication service of December 13, 1964. Following worship, we will gather for a free catered brunch in Fellowship Hall, where we will share memories of the birth of our beautiful and unique Sanctuary. We hope that you will be able to join us! A limited number of free tickets may still be available in the Church Office.

This year's Music Sunday, "O Holy Night," will be held on December 21st, during our 9:00 a.m. service and will feature each of our FPC choirs. The service will include choir solos, combined choirs, and congregational carols. There will be a special Music Sunday rehearsal on Wednesday, December 17th, from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary. Following rehearsal, the Sanctuary Choir will adjourn to the Choir Room, where they will rehearse for Christmas Eve, from 7:00-8:00. (There will not be a Wednesday WRAP dinner that evening.)

A Candlelight Communion Service of Lessons, Carols & Readings will be offered on Christmas Eve at both 5:30 and 8:30 p.m. The 5:30 p.m. service will feature a "Celebration of Gifts" prelude. All of our children and youth musicians are invited to offer an instrumental or vocal solo. Please contact me if you would like to share your gifts! If possible, prepare pieces based on Christmas carols.

Wind in the Willows, licensed through the Rodgers and Hammerstein Theatre Library, will be presented in April by our First Players under the leadership of Production Director Miki Newbry and Assistant Director Kate Buck. A national tour extension of Beauty and the Beast restricted the licensing of that show, but a full audition schedule has been completed for Wind in the Willows, and if you would like to be considered for a small role and/or as a stagehand, please contact the Church Office. The unforgettable characters from Kenneth Grahame's classic spring to life in this Broadway musical adaptation. Mole, a curious girl who leaves her underground life for one of adventure, meets the kindly Water Rat, who agrees to show her the world. Much more than a show about animals with human characteristics, Wind in the Willows is about the delicate balance among all living things and the surpassing value of friendship.


