

A Message from Brant

A few odds and ends for this month:

- 1) We will begin our next all-church study this month. I'll offer four sermons on "Just Walk Across the Room," a wonderful resource by pastor Bill Hybels of Willowcreek Church. Please look for a small group to connect with during the four weeks of this study, or make plans to attend the Y'All Come Class. This is a timely study for our life here at FPC.
- 2) You may have heard me talk about Open Table a few weeks ago. Open Table is a new ministry we're exploring. The idea is to help people change their lives through relational transformation. More than a band-aid, Open Table surrounds a brother or sister with anywhere from eight to ten people who help identify issues and then work toward solutions, meeting often enough, and long enough, to really make a difference. But to make this happen we need people who are willing to be part, so if God is nudging you in that direction, please contact me or Mission Elder Phill Pagels, so we can add you to the list.
- 3) You may have noticed that there are a lot of people here on Sunday mornings who you don't recognize. The Word Church has begun leasing space from us, and we're excited to welcome them as brothers and sisters in Christ. There may be some growing pains for a few months, but overall this is an exciting development for both churches!
- 4) Some of you have asked if it is still possible to get a signed copy of my book, "Fifty Skills You Need for a Decent Chance of Success." This is the book I wrote based on a sermon series last spring, and the answer is, YES! I will again offer signed copies during coffee time on Sunday, October 12th. The cost of each book is \$10, with all proceeds going to the Sanctuary 50th Anniversary Fund (and by-the-way, mark your calendars for that celebration on December 7th!).
- 5) Finally, if you are a "senior," please mark your calendars for the morning of Saturday, November 22nd, when we will hold a workshop called "Senior Matters." Brunch will be served courtesy of the Endowment Committee, who will do a presentation, as will Rosemary Fuller, RN.



Ms. Fuller is the Director of Health & Wellness at Oakwood Creative Care, and will speak on memory loss and the fears associated with it. We'll also be treated to musical entertainment from the church choir. It's going to be a wonderful morning!

Featuring opera, musical theater, hymns, and spirituals, there will be something to awaken a beautiful memory in everyone. On Sunday morning, November 2nd, Stephanie and Tom will offer special music during our 9:00 a.m. All Saints' Communion Service at FPC.

We will celebrate the 50th anniversary of our church Sanctuary on Sunday, December 7th. Our featured artist for worship will be organist Dorothy Riess. "Dr. Dorothy" started piano with her mother at age four and won her first competition at seven. The summer of her 16th year she took some organ lessons to become high school organist and had her own radio show of pop tunes on KTOW, Oklahoma City. At the University of Oklahoma she became a protégé of the legendary Mildred Andrews and won many competitions including the American Guild of Organists National in San Francisco, 1952, at age 20. The death of her beloved father from complications of Diabetes changed her life resulting in a decision to become a Doctor. She was awarded a Doctor of Medicine degree in 1969. Four years of post-grad study qualified her to practice Internal Medicine which she continued in Pasadena until retirement in 2000! After relocating to Las Vegas she resumed organ playing (some 50 years later!) and serves as Associate Organist at First Christian Church, Las Vegas. She performed her 75th birthday concert at the University of Nevada Las Vegas in 2006, her 77th at First Christian Church Las Vegas in 2009, and her 80th at UNLV in 2011. She was featured artist for the American Guild of Organists Region IX Convention in San Francisco, July 2011, performing at First Congregational Church, Berkeley, the same venue as her winner's recital in 1952!



After we stuff the Resource Bags (with materials supplied by the City), we'll distribute to approximately 170 homes to the east of the meeting place. Bring water and a hat and a smile!



Operation Christmas Child

Once again our small group is inviting anyone from the congregation that is interested in helping us in providing Christmas Shoeboxes to the needy children of the world. In 1993 Franklin Graham's Samaritan's Purse launched the Operation Christmas Child program. Since then Samaritan's Purse has delivered shoe boxes to over 113 million children worldwide. In just the last four years, over 1.1 million children have prayed to accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior through Operations Christmas Child's follow-up discipleship program, The Greatest Journey.



This is our 7th year collecting shoe boxes and we have set a goal of 100 boxes. Would you please help us reach that goal? We will have shoe boxes available sometime in late October. However, you can use a standard size shoe box. You have the choice of selecting a boy or girl in one of these three age categories: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Gift ideas are: toys, school supplies, hygiene items, hard candy or lollipops (double bagged), socks, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights with extra batteries, t-shirts, caps, etc.

We are asking that the shoe boxes be returned to the church on or before November 16th as we need to deliver them to the collection point between November 17th and 23rd. 
