## *A Message from Lois*

“When they came to Jerusalem, they were welcomed by the church and the apostles and elders...” **Acts 15:4**

Thank you for your gracious welcome! You have been so warm, welcoming and encouraging to both Bert and me! I am honored that Session selected me as your interim pastor and that Presbytery approved my commissioning to serve FPC Mesa. I am awed that our Lord seems to have been orchestrating all of this for a while now as I look back and see how pieces of God’s plan came together.

Even though most of you know me, here’s a bit of an introduction...

My first career was nursing. After I married Bert, and suddenly had four kids ranging from 9 to 18, I went into administration at the University of Alaska Fairbanks Health Center for 10 years followed by one and a half years as an instructor in UAF’s Allied Health program.

I heard God’s call to pastoral ministry in 2002 and began training in the Commissioned Lay Pastor program with the Presbytery of Yukon. I was commissioned in February 2004 to serve University Community Presbyterian Church in Fairbanks as an Administrative Pastor. In August 2004 I became the moderator for Atqasuk Chapel, a small native congregation on the North Slope, 60 miles southwest of Barrow. I served Atqasuk for seven years visiting quarterly and staying a week at a time. I served as interim pastor for New Hope Methodist Presbyterian Church in North Pole, Alaska, and as interim associate pastor for First Presbyterian Church, Anchorage.

Bert and I decided to ‘snow bird’ to Mesa four years ago. We found this church right away and got hooked! I started volunteering on staff as your parish visitor. Eventually, I started preaching...so here we are today. Fortunately, one of the pieces I referred to earlier had us purchase a condo last spring just 2.3 miles from the church so, once we get settled, we’ll have a nice home to spend the next couple years with you. That’s right, we won’t be going back to Alaska next summer.

Today we begin the journey of the interim process. We have work to do. I pray that all of you are already praying for the man or woman who is to be your new pastor. For God is already at work putting pieces together.

**Happy New Year!** Our great Visser-Rowland organ was installed in 1991, and this year we mark the beginning of its 25th season. If you'd like to learn more about the organ, *Rex: The King of the Instruments* will be offered in worship on Sunday, January 4th, at 9:00 a.m. Using a narrator and live music, the piece will describe the majesty of the organ and its music.

Internationally acclaimed pianist Sam Rotman will lead us in worship on Sunday, January 18th, at 9:00 a.m.! He will be presented as a part of our church Artist Series, and an additional freewill offering will be received during the worship service. When Sam Rotman made his debut at the age of 16 with the San

Antonio Symphony Orchestra before an audience of 6,000 people, the Baldwin Keynote Magazine wrote, "Sam Rotman is a pianist with abundant potential." Mr. Rotman received his Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from the Juilliard School in New York City. While a student, he was the recipient of nine awards in the form of grants, scholarships, and prizes. Subsequently, he has been among the winners in five piano competitions, both in the United States and Europe. The most prestigious award was that of Laureate Winner in the 4th International Beethoven Competition in Vienna, Austria. Mr. Rotman participated in the 6th International Tchaikovsky Piano Competition in Moscow, Russia. He has given over 2200 performances in the United States, Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, South and Central America, Africa, South Africa, Europe and Asia, totaling 58 countries. Mr. Rotman has devoted a specific area of his musical life to the study and performance of the works of Beethoven. Beginning with a series of all-Beethoven concerts in 1970 (the Beethoven bi-centennial), he was presented on Public Broadcast System in a special Beethoven concert. Mr. Rotman has released four recordings, which are available on his website, [www.samrotman.com](http://www.samrotman.com). Mr. Rotman's testimony "Performance" has appeared in Contact, published by Christian Business Men, and The Good News Broadcaster, published by The Radio Bible Class. His article "Classical Music and the Christian" was published in The Banner of Truth Magazine, Scotland, The Sword and Trowel, Arkenstone, a Christian Arts Magazine, and The Christian Arts, Inc. Newsletter.


