- Organ Postlude-Recital, Dr. Charles Sedgwick III Part of Sanctuary Celebration Series
- Training Sessions for Communion Servers, led Dan Reeves
- Easter Sunrise Service on the Sanctuary Patio, with breakfast provided by Jo & Don Wilson
- Created a database of 105 potential communion services
- Bryan Tryon volunteered to serve as the Worship representative to our HolyGrounds service.
- Worship was held in Fellowship Hall during July.

Montlure Presbyterian Camp was held in Wilcox, Arizona in summer of 2014. Twelve children and youth attended through our church, and we were able to sponsor them with \$2,255 in scholarship funds!

Join us on Wednesday nights from 5:00 – 7:00 for WRAP! We offer worship skills, recreation, fellowship, dinner, games and Bible study. This month the themes are:

We truly feel blessed at our preschool as we look back at what 2014 has given us! There have been many new things happening that are bringing new families from the community to join us. We are thrilled to announce that we are a **3-star Program of Excellence** through the **Quality First Scholarship Program!** The teachers have worked so hard to make sure that we qualified for this high level of notoriety and distinction! They truly are the heart and soul of this program and it certainly showed during the assessment process. I am so proud of all of the program of the start o





them, especially Nicki McInelly and Kristy Biggs for being the

focus classroom for the entire process. A huge Thank You goes out to all of the teachers for creating a loving and deeply caring environment for the families at First Presbyterian Preschool. This really makes a big difference!

We also had a beautiful partnership with Pastor Brant Baker and Dr. Mark Ramsey this past year during our weekly chapel time with the families. They have encouraged the children to grow in their faith and love of God. There are many families who join us as we worship each week. We are sad to see Pastor Brant leave but know that he is called to do other work for the people of God in another capacity.

Our facility is licensed through the State Department of Health Services to provide services for 59 children in 3 classrooms. The 2013-14 school year ended with 44 children enrolled and 30 of those kids went on to Kindergarten in August 2014! When we started the 2014-15 school year we had 29 children enrolled in 2 classrooms, Pre-K

and the 3's class. By the end of 2014 we had 35 kid enrolled, which is at full capacity for the 2 classrooms! We also are a Department of Economic Security certified site which means that we are able to support those families in the community who are receiving services for childcare coverage so that they can work or go to school. We had 3 children utilizing the DES childcare program.

We are still receiving the benefits of participating in the Quality First Scholarship Program. There was a change from last year's participation to this year. We went from receiving bi-weekly coaching services to weekly coaching services from Southwest Human Development. Our coach comes in to help support the work of our teaching staff by providing quality resources, support and trainings for the entire center. The difference that has occurred is that two of our teachers (Debbie Warneke and Rachelle Schuster) voluntarily signed up to participate in a pilot coaching program that supports their professional development by giving hands-on training and technical support for current teaching practices. It has been a wonderful experience for them.



Our funding from the Quality First Grant has also changed how many scholarship they will distribute to each of the participating centers. For the 2013-14 school year we were allotted 18 full-time scholarships. For the 2014-15 school year they spread out their funding to more participating sites and decreased our number of scholarships to just 10 full-time scholarships. This reduction in funding really impacted our decision to change the hours of the preschool from the 6:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m. schedule to the current 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. schedule that we are running now. It is also one of



the reasons why we had to go from 3 classrooms to 2 classrooms for the 2014-15 school year.

There have been a few physical changes around the preschool as well. During the summer monsoon season, we sustained great damage to the Jackson B room when the water came through the doors and the roof leaked and brought down part of the ceiling. In late October, the church agreed to replace the roof over that classroom and we have not had any problems since. Due to this major issue, we had to move the children from that class to the Jackson C/D classroom to remain open and operational. This is where they remain for the duration of this school year.

As we look forward to 2015, we are STILL in great need of a total

remodel of the playground bathrooms and continue to work on partnering with the church to budget for this. It is a major undertaking but a VERY necessary one for the professional appearance of the preschool to the community that we serve, as well as maintaining the safety of the facilities for our licensing requirement. We are asking for your prayers and financial support to make this possible in the next school year.

Lastly, we want to welcome Interim Pastor Lois Hildenbrand. We look forward to sharing our weekly chapel time with her and the ministry of the church! We appreciate all of your love and continuing support to make the Preschool a ministry of the church. We are very blessed and know that God has so much in store for these children, families and the staff that work with them. — Respectfully submitted, Shiloh Murillo

Just as last year, most of our efforts have been on maximizing our online presence. We have also been trying to do more with Facebook as a way of getting the word out about FPC. The best evangelism, however, happens as we invite our friends and neighbors!

Assimilation

The Assimilation Deacon is responsible to contact second time visitors to our church. Phone calls welcome them to our church and answer questions. The other responsibility is assisting with the new member class, telephoning the list of potential attenders reminding them about the class.

Seasonal Ministries

Blood drive: The Mission Commission of FPC in partnership with the American Red Cross once again hosted two blood drives. The spring blood drive held in May had 30 registered donors and they collected 29 blood products. For the November blood drive we had 33 registered donors and they collected 27 units of blood. The Red Cross has been delighted with the outcomes, and we as a church have provided a valuable service to our community.

Angel Tree: We sponsored three neighborhood families this year. Once again, as is a tradition of FPC, we provided gifts to each of the family members, as well as a holiday meal, other food stuffs, and an assortment of household and personal items.

Mesa Presbyterian Ministries

Mesa Presbyterian Ministries (MPM) had a busy year in 2014. The total number of calls when the MPM phone line was open continues to exceed 500, with about 1/3 of those receiving assistance of some sort: utilities, rent, food, meals, medical, transportation, and other miscellaneous items.

Deacon's Food Cupboard

The Food Cupboard continues to have high demand, with approximately 60 bags being given out each week. If each of these 3000 bags goes to a family of four, there is an impact of 12,000 people served, and an estimated dollar value of nearly \$120,000! New shelving was added to the pantry, so the number of bags has increased to 65 per week. Thank you, congregation, for your generous support of the food pantry.

Labauch Literacy

Over 57 served as tutors this past year, giving over 2,500 hours of service. Tutors and support staff spent another 2,600 hours driving, training, and tracking tutors. We had have served 91 students from primarily Asian and Hispanic backgrounds. Once more, students became U.S. citizens, and three conversations classes helped many others learn how to interact with people of another culture. All in all, a very productive year! The support of FPC is greatly appreciated.

The Ministry Commission is the "business arm" of the church. It oversees Property and Grounds, Stewardship, the Finance Committee, Personnel, Nominating and Session.

Property

2014 brought many maintenance challenges to Dave's Crew, which is comprised of three men in their 70s. There were several work orders submitted to repair/replace small items and make repairs to church facilities and the Preschool buildings - from the simple (door stopper, hinge and lock repairs, electrical and lighting repairs, etc.) to much larger items (Dave's Crew designed and installed a patio irrigation system). Other maintenance/repairs were handled by third party vendors (several HVAC issues including the repair/replacement of some units; new roof for the north Preschool buildings, which required partial wall and total floor replacement due to water damage; roof, roof board and eve repairs to the roof on the Sunday School building; metal covers to replace the original copper cladding on the sanctuary roof support beams because the copper was stolen (good news: the thief is now in jail!); six new 20 Amp 120 Volt duplex outlets were added to the north and south walls of Fellowship Hall, to support events held in that area, and too many other tasks to mention.

I would like to invite anyone who has any kind of maintenance skill to step up and offer some time to Dave's Crew. We meet at 8:30 a.m. every Wednesday morning to make repairs/adjustments/replacements to our campus infrastructure. As stated earlier, there are only three of us doing this work, and we could use help from time to time. There are some days when we only have a few work orders, but there are other days when we have too many to complete during our shift. If you would like to join us, you will be VERY welcome!

Stewardship and Finance

David Frederick The Finance Committee consists of David Frederick who serves as Stewardship Elder, Church Treasurer and Chief Financial Officer; Property Elder Allan Schultz; Endowment Chair Jack Gunter; Ex-officio member Jim Schwartzmann, and at-large members Brent Gregory, Mary Jane Hee and Jan Montgomery. Meeting records are kept by Carol Gerlach, Clerk of Session. Interim Pastor, Lois Hildenbrand, also attends our meetings as does the church bookkeeper, Kathe Patchin, during discussion and review of the monthly financial reports.

The committee meets monthly to review the church's financial reports and took the following actions in 2014:

- Responsibly disbursed the funds of the Marshall and Radabaugh estates.
- Developed a compensation package for the Interim Pastor, Lois Hildenbrand.
- David Frederick was appointed as Chief Financial Officer by the Session.

In November, David Frederick sent a letter to all members of the congregation for the 2015 Pledge Drive and noted that salaries, expenses and utility bills are supported by the General Fund while large projects, like maintaining our campus structures, are funded from the Capital Fund.

Because of your faithful giving, we completed several improvements to our campus. We improved the appearance of Fellowship Hall, constructed a useable courtyard and installed new electrical service boxes that now meet all safety codes.

The church uses the Building Fund as a reserve for big projects which are very important to sustaining a beautiful, functioning campus. These needs do not go away just because we depleted the fund to make improvements. We have tried to be faithful stewards of your gifts and ask that you continue giving at the same levels that you did last year, or even set a goal to pledge more than last year to help us plan a responsible budget for 2015.

The Nominating Committee has the responsibility of presenting qualified candidates for Elder and Deacon positions each year. For the first six months of 2014, in addition to myself as chairman, the committee was composed of Mary Jane Hee as Deacon and Randy Gray, Ellen Hickey and Renita Jurgensen as members at-large from the congregation, plus the pastor as ex officio. The only change beginning in June was that Steve Post replaced Randy Gray. We have already put together a slate of officers to present to the congregation for the Class of 2018, whose term will begin in June of 2015. We are also responsible for filling any vacancies that may arise. Please continue to hold us in your prayers as we seek potential candidates to faithfully serve our congregation.

During 2014, Session met in ten Stated Meetings and four Called Meetings. In addition to the Annual Congregational Meeting in February, there were two Called Congregational Meetings. We met with the Deacons and church staff for our Annual Retreat in August. Ten new members were added to the Active Roll and 51 members were transferred or removed. Membership as of December 31, 2014 is 319.

Endowment

The Endowment Committee consists of Jack Gunter, Brent Gregory, Mary Jane Hee, Ron Peyton, Jim Schwartzmann, and Skeets Throckmorton, with David Frederick, stewardship elder, serving as an ex-officio member. The committee met five times during 2014 and has undertaken the following actions:

- Continued oversight of the Endowment Funds including the Kissinger, Mehlhop, Stubblefield, and Montlure Funds with a total value of \$106,545.10 as of December 31, 2014. In addition, the General Endowment Fund value as of December 31, 2014, was \$102,360.61 and the Capital Endowment Fund value as of December 31, 2014 was \$46,314.39. The Worship Arts Endowment Fund value as of December 31, 2014, was \$11,151.10.
- Gifts of \$3,000 and \$1,500 were received into the General Endowment Fund and a gift of \$10,000 gift was
 received into the Worship Arts Endowment Fund.
- Disbursed \$1,500 of the Montlure Fund income for camp scholarships, disbursed \$168 of the Stubblefield Fund income for seminary tuition, disbursed \$284 of the Kissinger Fund income for seminary tuition and testing and \$310 of the Mehlhop Fund income for an adult education class honorarium.
- Continued to interpret the endowment concept to the congregation in conjunction with an Endowment Fund brochure, Minutes for Mission, and a Fall Endowment brunch presentation, conveying the need for further contributions to the Endowment Fund.

The committee will continue to serve the endowment needs of the membership of FPC.
