A Message from Lois

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit... All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "... this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

This year FPC Mesa will celebrate Pentecost May 17th. Pentecost celebrates the fact that Jesus' love for us is so great that he asked God to give the Holy Spirit to be with us always so we would not have to make this journey through life alone. The Holy Spirit empowers us to be the disciples Jesus needs us to be, and to re-present Christ to the world – be his hands and feet, and examples of his love and grace.

Think about that. What does that mean for you and me? What would our life be like without that precious gift of our Holy Companion, the still small voice that guides us, sustains us, empowers us?

FPC's selection of its Mission Study team is timely to coincide with Pentecost. This is an apt time for our old (and young) men (and women) to dream dreams, see visions and prophesy what God has in store for the ministry and mission of FPC. The Nominating Committee has been at work and the Session will soon select the team of individuals God is asking to lead the Mission Study.

Remember, the Mission Study is an integral part in preparing our congregation for its new pastor. We must do the work of discovering our unique mission and ministry so we know what we're looking for in a pastor. I pray you will look forward to taking your part in the discussions that will be part of the study.

Traditionally, the Holy Spirit is represented by the color red, by flames and by the dove symbol. You'll notice that the paraments (the table covering on the Communion table and the fabric on the front of the pulpit) are red on Pentecost. Please join me in honoring Pentecost by wearing red, or whatever your preferred "flame" color is, to worship on May 17th. Let us celebrate God's giving of the Holy Spirit to the church.

The Valley Chamber Chorale will present a free concert of music for choir and organ on Saturday, May 2nd, at 4:00 p.m. in our Sanctuary. Building on a nucleus of singers who were graduates of Larry Wittig's Paradise Valley High School Concert Choir, the Valley Chamber Chorale invited Christopher Samuel in 1988 to become con-

ductor and artistic director and expanded into a community choir that included members from all parts of the Valley. Ultimately reorganizing as an auditioned chamber choir under a not-for-profit status, the group took the name “Valley Chamber Chorale” to reflect the breadth of the area communities represented by its members. Since 1988, the ensemble has performed at the state convention of the Music Educators National Conference, the Western Region Convention of the American Guild of Organists, and the “World's Largest Organ Concert” with guest artist Joan Lippincott. The group's compact disc of Renaissance motets and madrigals, “O Sing Joyfully,” can be found in bookstores locally and in select cities nationally. The Valley Chamber Chorale is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to enlightening the community and enriching its culture. Through skilled performances of choral programs featuring an eclectic repertoire with emphasis upon unaccompanied works of the Renaissance and selections by Twentieth Century American composers, the Chorale offers entertaining and educational concerts at a variety of venues throughout the Phoenix Metropolitan area.

The Central Arizona Chapter of the American Guild of Organists will present organist Lew Williams for the final event of its chapter year. The concert will be held at Organ Stop Pizza (1149 E. Southern Ave., Mesa) from 12:00 to 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 23rd. The cost for the lunchtime concert will be \$12 per person (cash only, payable at the door), and reservations are due by May 16th. Caregiving is a task entrusted to us by God: children, youth, spouses, parents and grandparents. This May Friendship Day Celebration is for all people who struggle with their calling of caring for the needs of others. Lois Hildenbrand will be the speaker. The Celebration will begin at 10:00 a.m., with breads and beverages at 9:30 a.m.

CWU is the National Sponsor for Fellowship of the Least Coin, which was started in 1956 by Shanti Soloman, an Indian woman who was part of a Presbyterian Peace Mission to Korea. She had a vision of every woman putting the least coin of their country aside as a token of prayer. And so the International Fellowship of the Least Coin was born. Today the group gives hundreds of thousands of dollars in grants to support projects around the world that benefit women and children. 

SANCTUARY ROOF

The Session has decided that it is time to replace the sanctuary roof. Some of you may know that this is the original roof, installed to these fifty years ago. While it is still beautiful from a distance, up close it is showing some significant wear and tear. A leak could significantly damage our beloved pipe organ and cause more damage than the cost of a roof.

Stewardship season will come early this year as the Committee begins planning the capital campaign to raise enough money to begin work. We are still looking at our options, but preliminary estimates tell us that it will cost over \$250,000. This campaign will be a significant undertaking and require multiple years to complete. I will let you know more details as soon as I know them. It is no longer an option, it must be done. And God willing and with your faith, it will happen.




SESSION NOTES
