A Message from Lois

PSALM 146

Capital Fund Update

Some you may have already heard about the new Capital Fund drive. We're starting early this year because we have a big job ahead of us. The cost is estimated to be \$250,000, therefore it will be a multi-year campaign. We already have about \$70,000 in the capital fund, so that leaves only \$180,0000 left to raise. Our goal is to raise \$100,000 by June of next year.

I have already heard from some enthusiastic people who want to contribute. One anonymous donor has issued a challenge to the congregation. They will match all pledges with an equal amount of their own. This means that anybody who contributes to the capital fund will see their money double. This is a great way to kick off the campaign. The deadline for this is July 31, which leaves about two weeks to go and is limited to the first \$5,000. So please consider adding your name to the roof capital fund.

I will be giving periodic updates during the year to keep you the congregation informed about our progress. If you too would like to be a "roof supporter," simply make a notation on your payment that it is for the capital campaign. I hope you will join with me in this important effort to maintain a roof over our heads.
