The Mission Information Form is what the denomination uses to match this church with potential candidates.

In the mean time, I will also be creating some opportunities for us to gather to discuss the history of our church. One of the tasks of the congregation during the interim time is to "Come to terms with History." You folks are a wealth of information. Shortly I will put together a few gatherings where we will create a time-line of this congregation's history. It will be fun, and we'll all learn a bit!

May God continue to guide us as we make our way through this process of discernment to find just the person God has in mind for our congregation. Keep praying!
