September, 1947

- Two new members were received into church.
- A discussion on the supplying of a pastor until January 1, 1948 took place. It was suggested that the church could have a student pastor from the University of Arizona each Sunday or a fill-in pastor from Phoenix. The decision was to have a pastor supplied from Phoenix.
- It was decided to have the Every Member Canvass in November and to have as many members as possible sign pledge cards.
- It was also suggested that a fellowship and study group be formed to meet once a month for study and for social. It was suggested that this group have a definite program each time. It was also announced that a record of church preference of Mesa students is available thru Mr. Taylor.


September, 1955

- The Treasurer reported for the Benevolence Committee that our contributions are falling behind our pledges.
- Construction is progressing on the new education building. Some dissatisfaction was expressed over some of the details of construction and the supervision of the construction by the architect.
- The Music Committee noted that Mrs. Alliene Philips had been playing for the summer services and a total of \$30 was owed to her for past services. She will continue to play with the understanding that she receives \$5 per week for her services.
- Session approves and supports the Wednesday evening prayer meetings which were organized by the ladies and are now being held regularly.

September, 1965

- A presentation of the plans for the combined Building and General Fund drive was given.
- The Building and Grounds Committee is investigating irrigation possibilities for the land to the east of the parking lot.
- A report of necessary repairs for the new sanctuary will be ready shortly.
- A request for the use of several rooms in the Christian Education Building by the Mesa Education Association was approved.
- The Boy Scouts have donated \$200 toward alterations in the social hall to make more storage space.

Jordan Gustafson, Director of Student Ministry at Valley Presbyterian Church in Paradise Valley, gave the sermon on Sunday August 9th. He charged us all to go out and ask ourselves every day: "What am I willing to do to follow Jesus?" Furthermore, he challenged us to be willing to step out of comfort zone into wherever that might take us. "The Mission Commission leads the church in the proclamation of the Good News of Jesus Christ in both word and deed, involves the church in local, national and worldwide mission and is the liaison with those who are involved in mission partnerships." (FPC Mesa Officer's Handbook) Here at FPC many in our congregation have experiences in proclaiming the Good News in a variety of works. As a relative newcomer, I don't even begin to know all that history. What I do know is there is much to do and a great need for more people to do it.

There is much mission work going on in the church right now. We, as a congregation, readily step up to help with donations for food pantry, for school supplies, for Christmas Angels and for Christmas Shoe Boxes. We house I-Help ladies and give them a hot breakfast. Mesa Presbyterian Ministries (MPM) provides rental and utility assistance. Our youth have gone to "Save our Starving Children." We help out with Mesa Make a Difference Day. We host blood drives twice a year. Presbyterian Women support mission work around the world. In the past we have taken groups on mission trips. For several years we have been involved with working with Habitat for Humanity. Sewing and knitting groups provide warmth and comfort through their craft. We have a prison ministry. I have tried to name as many as I know. If you know of a mission I left out, please contact me with a note in my box or a phone call so that we as a commission may have the whole picture.

All that said, I would like to invite you to look in your heart and see if you feel led to participate in any of the following:

- We would very much like to send youth and adults on at least one mission trip a year. We are beginning to plan what that might look like for a spring trip. Anita Ramsey and I will co-facilitate it, but it would be valuable to have a group of us to make it happen. Is this something you might be interested in?
- In the area of evangelism, Bill Anderson is our idea man. He needs help with putting into action outreach in our church neighborhood. Is this something that might be in keeping with your time and talents? Along the same lines, Scot Logan is the assimilation deacon, and he can use help with follow-up phone calls and outreach to visitors and new members.
- Sandy Clark, our Hunger Action Enabler, does an amazing job coordinating all to do with the food pantry. Volunteers help unload the food truck, pack bags and distribute them. If this is something you would like to help with, please let Sandy know.
- A big thank you to all of you who stepped up with donations of pasta and tuna when the need for that was great. Those items are well stocked for now. There is, however, a need for items with meat like chili, ravioli, spaghettios, etc. Cereal is always needed.
- The fall blood drive is coming soon. The need for blood is ever present. Darlene Sitzler will be signing up people in Fellowship Hall October 11-18. Mark your calendars for October 25th from 9:00-2:00.
- You will have an opportunity to make a difference with giving to our Peace offering on October 4th, which is World Wide Communion Sunday. Watch for details in the bulletin.

Being of service in the work of the Lord takes time and commitment. It often takes us out of our comfort zones. It does beg the question: What am I willing to do to follow Jesus and to carry forward His work in the world? May the Holy Spirit fill your heart and lead you where you are meant to go! Amen

Small Group Study Resources

Is your small group looking for a small group study? FPC has a few excellent studies on hand (in the library), and we will be adding one new book for small group study, as well. While there are no plans for a coordinated all-church study, the Discipleship Commission has developed these suggestions that can help if your group is looking for ideas:

Already on hand:

- Advance: Go Unless You Get a No, a one-session workshop by Erwin McManus. Includes a DVD and discussion guide. Focus is discernment and choices to take action in your life as a Christian.
- Breakaway: Because You Didn't Set Out to Be Just Like Everybody Else, a six-session study by Andy Stanley. Focus is on individuality and the true liberation offered by the holy spirit. May be good for older teens, but could be for any group. Includes DVD and study guide.
- Guardrails: Avoiding Regrets in Your Life, a six-session study by Andy Stanley challenges us to stop flirting with disaster and establish some personal guardrails. We have the DVD, and lessons guidebook.
- Twisting the Truth: Learning to Discern in a Culture of Deception, a six-session study by Andy Stanley with DVD and participant's guide. Exposes some common ways God's truth gets twisted.

Details of these studies can be found on Amazon, or on the materials in the library.

Coming soon:

• For the Love: Fighting for Grace in a World of Impossible Standards, by Jen Hatmaker. This is a book (not a "study" or "workshop" like the resources above). The theme is identifying resources we already have as individuals, family members, and community members to "empower ordinary members of our churches to take ownership of the life of the church." This book might be a good stimulus for discussion as our church begins its self-study during our journey to find our new pastor and, in the process, redefine ourselves.
