A Message from Lois



*Where's your heart?
For there your treasure
will be also!*

What is your heart's desire? What is the force that drives you? To put it in biblical terms, what is the treasure of your life? Matthew 6: 19-21 says,

“Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

What do you spend most of your time doing? If you have a day off, what do you do with it? When you have the opportunity to choose what your time is spent on, how do you spend it? Name that and you have also named your treasure and you have found where your heart is.

As humans, it is easy to fall into the trap of giving our hearts to things other than God. Maybe we are addicted to exercise or alcohol or sex, or maybe we spend too much time working or keeping the house clean, or keeping our motorcycle finely tuned. While there is nothing wrong with some of these, as Christians we must be careful not to give our heart to our bikes or homes or bodies to anything other than the One we serve.

“For in God we live and move and have our being,” to quote the apostle Paul (Acts 17:28). Look over your life for a just a moment. If you find you have made anything besides Christ your treasure, and given your heart to anything but Him, then take a moment and ask forgiveness for that and then have an honest conversation with God about how to change that. Ask God to be your treasure. Ask God to be your all in all. Here's the kicker though...wait long enough to get the answer!

I pray for each of you today that Christ will be your treasure and that your heart will belong totally to Him.

I-Help Information

Friendship Village of Tempe's Laundry Department does the laundry for our I-Help ladies. In recognition of this service, an article was featured on the Arizona Leading Age's website. The article is below:

Giving Back Helps Retirement Community Hit Million Pound Mark for Laundry

A million pounds is a lot of anything. A million pounds of laundry is a bit like running a Boeing 747 through your machine. No small task. At Friendship Village Tempe, a local retirement community, hitting the million pound mark for laundry in a year wouldn't happen without a connection to local charity that all started with some generous and creative residents.

Starting with a resident named Ruth Kearns, the laundry partnership with the Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program (I-Help) was born. Today, Friendship Village serves four I-Help shelters, and does about 19,000 additional pounds of laundry each year to help make a difference. That 19,000 number helped put Friendship Village over the million mark.

There is a mixture of good news and bad news on FPC's financial front. As of April 30th, we are running a **Pledge Offering** monthly deficit of \$3,600. So far this year we have a deficit of offerings versus expenses of \$11,800. With your help we can climb out of negative territory by the time the weather gets cool again. Since your pledges form the basis of our budget, please verify that your pledge amount is being fulfilled. Remember, every little bit helps. As we begin our search for a new pastor, some expenses could increase as we conduct interviews and research each candidate. Once a pastor is selected, our salary expenses will certainly increase.

On the positive side we are making tremendous progress in **Capital Offerings**. We have received \$19,500 so far this year in **Capital Offerings** which is \$6,500 more than budgeted. Most of this will be applied toward our goal of funding a new sanctuary roof. The **Stewardship Campaign** to encourage "roof support" has now raised a total of \$143,000 and we are at 57% of our goal. With your continued giving, we are on track to have \$250,000 by the end of this year.

Your **Endowment Committee** is responsibly investing funds for many church purposes. As an example, over the past few years we have helped our youth pay summer camp costs using earnings from our Montlure Endowment. Recently, one of you gave an anonymous gift of \$1,000 toward this purpose so we will be able to help even more. We are fortunate to have such caring people in our midst. Thank you all for continuing to support all of our endowments. Please contact the church office if you are interested in helping or starting an endowment or for information on estate-giving. —Dave Frederick, Stewardship Elder
