A Message from Lois

Jesus said to him, "There is still one thing lacking. Sell all that you own and distribute the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.

Luke 18:22

If there was one thing Jesus had on his mind, it was money. He seemed to think it was a matter of great spiritual significance. He seemed to link it to faith and justice and wholehearted discipleship. He seemed to imagine that generosity was a sure mark that we are to make in God's own extravagantly generous image.

Some preachers I know don't really like talking about giving or generosity. Maybe it's because we've heard too much the complaint that "the church is always asking for money." Or, maybe we are afraid we will offend someone. Or, maybe our own relationships with money are a little out of whack. I don't know, but for whatever the reason we shy away from this most liberating of topics.

And it is liberating. Think of the word generosity itself. Doesn't it just sound joyful and full of holy abandon? Free of the chains of fear and anxiety? Liberated from the constricting bonds of scarcity or greed. Study after study in brain science has found a direct link between generosity and overall happiness.

Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 2 Corinthians 9:7

Henri Nouwen in his book, <u>The Spirituality of Fundraising</u>, writes, "From the perspective of the gospel, fundraising is not a response to a crisis. First and foremost, it is a form of ministry. It is a way of announcing our vision and inviting other people into our mission. Vision and mission are so central to the life of God's people that without vision we perish and without mission we lose our way. In fundraising we are declaring, 'We have a vision that is amazing and exciting. We are inviting you to invest yourself through the resources God has given you – your energy, your prayers and your money, in this work to which God has called us.'"

You might ask, What is the mission of First Presbyterian Church? It is:

As followers of Jesus we will love the Lord our God with all our hearts, with all our souls and with all our minds.

And we will love our neighbors as ourselves and serve them in the name of Christ.

Operation Christmas Child: Once again our small group is inviting anyone from the congregation that is interested in helping us in providing Christmas Shoeboxes to the needy children of the world. In 1993 Franklin Graham's Samaritan's Purse launched the Operation Christmas child program. Since then Samaritan's Purse has delivered shoe boxes to over 113 million children in over 109 countries worldwide. Since 2010, 3.3 million children have prayed to accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior through Operations Christmas Child's follow-up discipleship program, The Greatest Journey.

This is our 8th year collecting shoe boxes, and we have set a goal of 100 boxes. Would you please help us reach that goal? We will have shoe boxes available sometime in late October, however, you can use a standard size shoe box. You

have the choice of selecting a boy or girl in one of these three age categories: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Gift ideas are: toys, school supplies, hygiene items, hard candy or lollipops (double bagged), socks, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights with extra batteries, t-shirts, caps, etc.

We are asking that the shoe box be returned to the church on or before November 13th as we need to deliver them to the collection point November 14th through 20th. SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- Session voted to use our 25% of the World Communion offering to help fund our sponsored missionary Leslie Vogel in Guatemala as a mission partner.
- FPC received \$39172 from the estate of Virginia Fansher. Session decided to allocate the gift as follows: \$10K to the organ refurbishing fund, \$10K to the roof fund, \$5K to General Endowment, \$2,750 to Habitat for Humanity, and the remaining \$11,173 to our new pastor fund. The purpose of the new pastor fund is not salary, but rather moving expense and other related hiring expenses.



- The Organ will get its long awaited refurbishment in October. A team from Texas will do the job. We will be without the organ for only one Sunday. None of this financing is from the General Fund.
- We have approved the final procedures changes and released the AD Hoc Committee with great thanks!
 These last two items are procedures for driving youth off-campus and an alcohol, gambling and tobacco policy. Ad Hoc Members are: Carol Gerlach, Barbara Walker, Brent Gregory, Jan Montgomery and Jim Bruening.
- The following officers elect, having completed training were examined and welcomed by session. Ruling Elder: Bill Rummler. Deacons: Dan Sitzler and Ruth Rummler.
- Also from the Clerk: It was recently pointed out to me that we send out periodic information about pledges received, but nothing about time and talent. I know there are those working on a time and talent survey for the congregation, but want to mention someone who has been quietly working in the kitchen for at least 6 years. I have been attending WRAP for several years, but did not realize how much work is done by Jen Martin. She supervises the kitchen serving and clean-up for WRAP. I was especially happy to see how much she cares about keeping us healthy by scrupulously sanitizing the kitchen each week. I do not wish to downgrade any other of our many volunteers. Let's celebrate them all!
