A Message from Lois

For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in [the gospel] the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, "The one who is righteous will live by faith." Romans 1:16-17

It is in this walk of faith that we experience the closeness and the joys of serving our Lord. It is here that

we experience the real meaning of life. It is not about how much we can have, but about giving ourselves totally and unconditionally to God.

Examine your life today and ask God to draw you closer and make you the person of faith God has called you to be, for the righteous shall live by faith!
