A Message from Lois

Transforming Resolutions

Jesus said, "...I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me." John 6:38

Many of us see the New Year as an opportunity to transform our lives by making New Year Resolutions. As Christians, the idea of transformation is a compelling resolution as all of us are called to become more and more Christ-like.

Here are four steps involved in being transformed. We must first realize we are not our own and that we have been bought and paid for with a price which we could not pay. With that in mind, we are to be slaves to our Lord and Savior. The only rights and privileges we have are those in Christ, which gives us access to God's abundant life. In John 6:38 we see that Jesus did not come to do His own will, but to do the will of God. 



CONGRATULATIONS on a job well done! A bit more than two years ago Session, with great encouragement from Finance Chair Dave Frederick, came to you to begin a fund-raising campaign for a new roof on the sanctuary. Our initial ‘guesstimate’ of the cost was \$250,000. Of that, through your generosity, we raised over \$169,000 in about a two-year span. We have since secured a firm bid with a good, reputable company for \$156,000. By the grace of God, this congregation set about the challenging plan to replace our sanctuary roof in order to protect our infrastructure and we succeeded! You will see progress soon. Praise be to God!

A lot is happening at FPC! We have signed a contract with a roofing contractor for our new steel roof that has the appearance of tile. The color, Sequoia Red, is similar to the color of our existing tile roof and compatible with other roof and building trim. The contract is for \$155,196.18, which is considerably less than our original estimate of \$250,000! Allan Schultz, our current property elder and corporation president, has been instrumental in making this project happen. He is a tireless worker and dedicated to the many responsibilities of his position. Allan, Bill Lents, John Peterson (aka Dave's Crew) have made many improvements (big and small) to our buildings and campus. I know I speak for everyone in thanking them for their faithfulness and weekly commitment to keep our campus looking so great.

Our Stewardship Campaign has gone very well with estimates of giving running well ahead of 2016. It appears that the narrative budget format was well received.

Mesa Presbyterian Ministries (MPM) has a new President - Jack Oliver. MPM's Board of Directors will be making other staff changes and additions in the near future.
