Pentecost Special Offering - Each year on Pentecost Sunday, which is June 4th this year, we celebrate the arrival of the Holy Spirit as a bringer of new life. With the Spirit's coming, we no longer need to settle



for business as usual, but can know the transforming, redeeming love of God that makes the impossible possible. The Pentecost Offering is one of the four Special Offerings of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and is about helping young people begin life with a strong start – a solid foundation of faith formed in the first third of life, from childhood through young adulthood. Gifts to Pentecost Offering unite young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas and unique gifts with the church and the world. Presbyterian congregations are finding new ways to minister to children at risk in their own communities. General Assembly programs are advocating for children and developing youth and young adult leaders. (reprinted from PCUSA) For-

ty Percent of the Pentecost Offering remains with our own congregation to support ministries with children. Once again, the Session of FPC Mesa has designated those funds will go to the Mission Trip. Ten Percent of the Offering supports "Educate a Child, Transform the World" national initiative. Twenty-five percent goes to support ministries with youth ages 12-18. And twenty-five percent goes to Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) opportunities.


