A Message from Ann

“Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you.”
(Jesus – as recorded in John 14:27)

Scripture tells us that Christ is our peace (Ephesians 2:14). We are encouraged to seek peace and pursue it (Psalm 34:14) and also assured that God will guide our feet into the way of peace (Luke 1:79). It is fitting then that as we greet one another to begin our time of worship, we greet one another with the peace of Christ!

Also known as passing the peace of Christ, this is an ancient and significant gesture that forms us in faith. Passing the peace is a tradition rooted in Scripture that embodies our Christian identity as peacemakers and trains our hearts, hands, and tongues in the ways of peace.

From the beginning of the early church, Christians have greeted one another with the peace of Christ. “Peace be with you” is a greeting Jesus himself used with his apostles. Paul opened his letters with the greeting, “Grace and peace be with you.”

Rather than greeting one another with a “How are you?” or asking about later lunch plans, we will try to transition to a time of passing the peace of Christ to those worshipping near us. This may even encourage some to sit in different places in the sanctuary occasionally in order to have the opportunity to greet new people on Sunday morning! It is also a warm and welcoming way to greet those visiting with us, without feeling a need to start up a conversation.

The gesture may be simple, but the meaning is profound. When we extend not only our hand but also Christ’s peace to one another, we identify with Jesus who extended his life for the peace of the world. In the midst of a divided world and culture, when we regularly pass the peace, we symbolize the unity we share in Christ and practice God’s call to maintain the bond of peace. We are encouraged to move beyond ourselves and create Christ-like community with others.

I want to acknowledge that this shift may feel awkward initially and that’s okay. It may move us outside our comfort zone. But if we think of this Christly gesture as extending hospitality to those around us and genuinely wishing Christ’s peace be upon them, I think we will acclimate quickly and find words that are comfortable for us. “The peace of Christ be with you.” “God’s peace to you.” “The peace of the Lord be with you.” Or simply “Peace” are all good options!

So it is with great hope I say to you: “The peace of Christ be with you!”

“Every day when the kids said good-bye, they said ‘Good-bye Ayden.’ They knew my name,” Ayden shared. Evie loved it when she heard “Sit by me, Evie. Sit by me.” They knew Evie’s name too. And we learned their names, Camille, Theresa, Trinity, Danielle, Starr, Demitra, Samantha, Kayah, Aden, Danny, Kendrell, Kaylen, Noahana, Ulani and the list goes on. We all know how it feels to be called by name. We made a point to call everyone, youth and adults, by their name. We actively engaged in the moments of playing, learning, laughing, singing, praying, celebrating, and enjoying God’s love. Older kids looked after younger children. Younger children followed and did what older children participated in. There was no fighting and arguing. When the daily video was shown with the pictures that Bryan had taken that day, all were focused on the make-shift screen, hooraying every face shown! During a devotional at Antelope Overlook at the end of the day, Fernando said “I want to sing the doxology.” He stood above us and sang out a beautiful rendition. The last day after Vacation Bible School was done and we had an hour before it was time for the community dinner, Robert orchestrated a game where the children had to plan together to get the rubber chicken from him. Ian had at least a dozen children gathered round him to strategize how to work together to do it...priceless!



Adults of FPC engaged in deep, meaningful conversations with adults of Tseyi Bidaa, learning about clan system, the cemetery issues, community dynamics, church history, family connections, and about their sunrise service at the edge of the canyon on Easter followed by the breakfast and church service. Virginia and Ella shared about the process and tradition of weaving. Peter E. and Nancy fed us well. Steve energized all as the Master of Ceremonies for opening and closing VBS. Jasmine with assistance from Carol S. and Ethan scooped out, served and engaged imaginations at her station. Ann and Peter made the Bible come alive with reenactments of scripture in Bible Adventures. Carol A. engaged the children with real life situations where the daily theme vibrated. Jeanne communicated the themes through coordination of snacks that involved creativity, as well as yummy treats to be eaten. Robert was most happy to be able to be outside and just play with the kids, reminding them of God’s great love through team work, running, playing, and laughing. As for me,



my heart is bursting at the seams with the joy of it all, the success of us all building relationships within our community and with theirs. Woven into all of that, was the majesty of the land, of the canyon, of God’s awesome creation. Truly the Holy Spirit was present from the planning, throughout the experiences and even as we carry on in our lives here in Mesa, with eyes to see anew, and with hearts expanded by what we shared. As we were loading in our cars to leave, it felt like family as we exchanged hugs and handshakes. “I will miss you!” “See you next year!”
