The Gift of Giving

While stewarding the many gifts God has given us is a year-round commitment and, indeed, an important spiritual practice, this is the time of year when we begin thinking more intentionally about our gifts in terms of pledging them to the mission and ministry of God as expressed through First Presbyterian Church. Created in the image of a very generous and giving God, giving is a core part of our identity as Christians.

We are called to care for the least of these and FPC does that very well through a variety of ministries including:

- Deacon's Food Cupboard – provides a bag of groceries for 50-60 people each week
- I-HELP – provides showers, two home cooked meals, and a safe place to be and to sleep for 25 women three Sundays per month
- Mesa Presbyterian Ministries – provides rental and utility assistance for the working poor in our community
- Annual mission trips to serve people and needs near and far

We minister to and serve those in our own congregation through worship, education, and fellowship opportunities in addition to Wednesday WRAP, GriefShare, VBS, Befriender ministry, and an active small group ministry. We have a vibrant and active preschool. Our space is utilized by many groups for many purposes such as Head Start, Boy Scouts, AA, and Square Dancing. What a bounty of gifts that are present here at FPC Mesa!

All of this ministry and much more happens as a direct result of your gifts ~ your tithes, your offering, your pledges. And, as you are probably well aware, there are ever increasing needs in our congregation and community. God is counting on us as God's faithful servants and followers of Jesus Christ!

I want to challenge you this fall to think not about giving to a budget, but rather giving to God for God's ongoing ministry here at FPC. I want to challenge you to think not about the burden of giving, but the gift of giving. What a gift it is to be able to express our deep gratitude to God for all God has done for us through a faithful response of sharing our gifts – and sharing them generously! It is truly a gift to reflect God's character in the gift of giving!

FPC Artist Series: In honor of American Architect Frank Lloyd Wright's 150th birthday, the Arizona Cantilena Chorale will present an FPC concert of music by American composers, in our Sanctuary on Sunday, October 29th, at 4:00 p.m. The program will include Randall Thompson's Frostiana: Seven Country Songs, three selections by Norman Dello Joio: Jubilant Song, A Fable and Of Crows and Clusters, and Howard Hanson's Psalm 150. A freewill offering will be accepted. The Chorale was established by its director, Dr. Glenn Bennett, in the summer of 2005 by bringing together the vocal talents of students and friends from past and current performing groups who have an ability to create a homogenous vocal blend. The Chorale's repertoire ranges from classical to contemporary choral works. They have worked with local symphony orchestras as well as collaborated with other choruses to perform major works such as Handel's "Messiah" and the "Messa di Gloria" by Puccini. Most recently, the Arizona Cantilena Chorale has performed in the international tour "Video Games Live" at the Mesa Arts Center. Additionally, they have performed with the Symphony of the Southwest in productions of Menotti's "Amahl and the Night Visitors," at both the Mesa Arts Center and the Valley Vista Performing Arts Center in Surprise, Arizona.

Mission Commission is gearing up for a full slate of activities going on!



Completed Projects Or Where Did our Money Go?

To bring you up to date on how we spent money in the last year and half I have listed some of the completed improvements we made.

1. Sanctuary roof. We obtained four roof replacements quotes for a new roof. The cost was estimated at \$250,000.00. Through several contractor interviews looking at different products and roofing plans we were presented with a plan for an all metal roof, 30 to 40 year life, installed for \$170,000 .00 completed. A savings of \$80,000.00.
2. We were very aware of the lack of proper lighting on our campus. We spoke to the city of Mesa to determine if we could raise the current parking light poles to about 30'. The answer was no because our property bumps up against residential property and higher lighting would not be permitted. We learned that we have to work with what we got.
 - a. We changed the eight lamps in the two existing pole lamps with much brighter LED lamps at about \$80.00 each. They should last about 8 -10 years verses the Metal Halide lamps that lasted 1 ½ years at \$100.00 each.
 - b. We added three pole mounted lamps in the gravel area between the sanctuary and south parking lots, they too are LED lamps with about a ten year life.
 - c. We have purchased a gable mounted LED flood lamp to be mounted at the roof peak above the sanctuary main double doors, this lamp should provide light to most of the east parking area.
3. We had painted the A and B youth rooms including both restroom/shower areas and kitchen. The Fellowship Hall rest rooms, Courtyard rest room and the CE office.
4. We hired a part time custodian for 18 hours a week for the same cost of the professional service for 10 hours a week. You will note that the campus is clean and bright once again. Her name is Belinda Clark, say hi to her and thank her for her very good work.
5. We contracted for exterminating service every three months to rid us of an insect invasion on our campus.
6. You will note that the Head Start and Preschool play ground has been greatly improved and made safer. This cost was paid by the Head Start program, Thank you to them.

There were several maintenance items handled by our Maintenance Supervisor and Dave's crew, most unseen by our congregation. We have the campus fire extinguishers and lighted exit signs and FH Kitchen stove hood fire system inspected by the Mesa FD and certified for one year. We have the underground Natural Gas lines inspected and certified for one year. Both of these inspections are paid for out of the Property Maintenance accounts.

There are many day to day repairs made by several church members from toilet replacement/repair, small paint jobs and several work orders to keep the Preschool and Head Start areas acceptable during State and County inspections.
