A Message from Ann

We are now in the midst of the season of Lent, a time of preparation for the celebration of Easter. With that in mind, here is some information you may find interesting followed by a reflection you may find meaningful during this season of self-reflection and self-examination.

Everything you Ever Wanted To Know About Lent

Where did Lent get its name?

The word “Lent” originally meant “springtime.” Because the church season always fell at that time of year, the name came to apply to it as well. Even after the word “Lent” was no longer used for spring, it was still used by the church to describe the season leading up to Easter.

Why does Lent last forty days?

The early church celebrated Lent only for a few days before Easter. Over the centuries, the length of the season grew until it was several weeks long. In the seventh century, the church set the period of Lent at forty days (excluding Sundays) in order to remind people of the duration of Jesus’ temptation in the wilderness.

How did the tradition of “giving up something for Lent” start?

Over the centuries, the church began to baptize and confirm people on days other than Easter Sunday. Lent was no longer a time of preparation for these events, but it remained as a special time of prayer and fasting. After the Reformation, the discipline of fasting became unpopular. Thus, as a way of preserving Lent as a time of self-sacrifice, the church leaders encouraged people to give up something during Lent that they enjoyed.

What does Lent mean for us today?

Lent is still the church season in which we prepare for Easter Sunday. It is a special time of prayer and reflection, of confession and self-sacrifice. It is a time to remember the temptation, the suffering, and the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Most of all, it is a time to ready ourselves for the humble thankfulness and sheer joy of Easter morning – it is a time to ready ourselves to meet our risen Lord once again!

The FPC Artist Series will present Organist Ilona Kubiaczyk-Adler in concert on Women's Sunday, March 4th, at 4:00 p.m. in our Sanctuary. Born in Pomerania, Poland, Ilona grew up during the era of communism and witnessed the country's transition to capitalism. Acquiring a passport at the age of 15 allowed her to see the West for the first time. The shock of the experience inspired her to explore the world beyond her home country. She has traveled, mainly as a performer, through most of Europe, and South and North America. She performs concerts as a soloist, chamber musician, and in duo Zeelab with Jacob Adler.

Celebrate the Gifts of Women Sunday is March 4th this year. This year our guest speaker is Rev. Deborah Kehle who is a Phoenix native. She has been an ordained PC(USA) pastor for 23 years and has served in churches in Pueblo, Colorado, Sun City, Arizona, and most recently in Santa Barbara, California, as a solo pastor for 6 years. She returned to Phoenix in 2016 to take part in the yearlong hospital chaplaincy training program at Banner University Medical Center in downtown Phoenix, which she completed in August 2017. Currently Rev. Deborah is working as a chaplain with Hospice of the West. The focus of this year's celebration is what it means to lead with love. Ugly Quilts Mission Project – PW will host a mission project to support the work of the Ugly Quilt Group of Mesa. This group was started in 1990. They make quilts out of donated fabric, sheets, blankets, and mattress pads. They make the sleeping bags for the homeless out of these materials and then tie the bedroll up with donated men's ties. Inside the bag they put travel size toothpaste, soaps, lotions, shampoos, toothbrushes, small combs, clothing items, wash cloths, towels, devotionals and various other items. While some of the quilts aren't as ugly as others, the idea is to not have them be so attractive that they may be stolen. You can find a listing of all items on the kiosk or in the church office. Boxes will be in the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall throughout the month of March for the items you wish to donate.

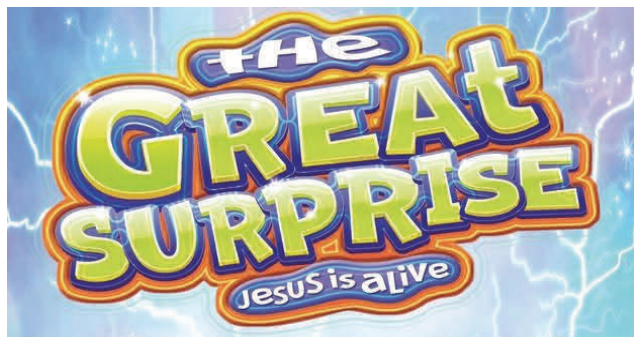

- Fast from discouragement... Feast on hope*
- Fast from lethargy... Feast on enthusiasm*
- Fast from idle gossip... Feast on prayerful silence*

MPM formerly known as Christ Häven was started at our church by Bob Gerlach in 2001. MPM provides Mesa residents in need with rental and utility assistance. The goal of MPM is to keep families in their current homes during financial difficulties. Nearly 200 families were helped by MPM in 2017. With your contribution we could do even more this year! Donations up to \$400 for a single filer and \$800 for joint filers can be used as a credit on your Arizona income tax return without having to itemize.
