Following worship, we'll enjoy a BBQ provided by our Fellowship Commission.

Margaret Johnson provided music reviews for several of our early Artist Series events, and recently she reviewed another event at our church, featuring Dr. Christopher Samuel and the Valley Chamber Chorale (January 7th in Fox Chapel). Here is an edited version of her review: "Today's concert was an eclectic mix of skilled performances of music from the 1500's through the 20th century. The program began with a selection from contemporary composer Alfred Fedak, entitled "Music Never Dies." This slow, beautiful, contrapuntal selection depicts the many ways in which music affects our lives. Three English renaissance *a cappella* selections followed: Christoper Tye's "O Come Ye Servants of The Lord", Adrian Batten's "Lord, We Beseech Thee," and a Thomas Tallis very contrapuntal and motet-like "All People That On Earth Do Dwell." "*Confirmata Hoc Deus*" by Jacob Handl showcased step-wise entrances with very moving polyphonic vocal parts. From modern composer Warren Martin, "My Spirit Longs For Thee" contrasted *a cappella* choral writing with a complex piano obbligato, which moved in and out among the voice lines but could stand on its own as a piano solo. In recognition of the Protestant Reformation, the Chorale presented two settings of "A Mighty Fortress Is our God": the first setting as a traditional hymn with trombone accompanying the singing and the second featuring trombone and piano together in broad melodic phrases, underscored by piano obbligato. Pure Americana evoked the selections from the second half of the program. Mixing African-American tradition with words based on poems of E.E. Cummings, the opening selection was titled "Sam Was A Man," with music by Vincent Persichetti. The Americana continued with an arrangement by Nina Gilbert and the hauntingly beautiful "Shenandoah" arranged by Douglas Wagner. Throughout the concert, Dr. Samuel held the audience's attention with not only the musical selections, but also with

generous historical anecdotes about each selection. The scene changed, evoking an intimate jazz lounge as the Chorale sang an arrangement of "As Time Goes By," accompanied by jazz chords in the piano background. The closing number was deceptively titled "Sing Something Simple," by Mac Huff. The song is a parody done in varied musical moods: witty, quiet, dramatic, operatic, amorous, all in close, complete, chorale-type harmony. Extended applause followed."



FPC Mesa is seeking a part-time Youth Director.

The Youth Director will work with the Pastor, Director of Christian Education, Youth/Young Adult Elder and Discipleship Commission to provide leadership and administrative direction for FPC's youth ministry. The ideal candidate is an individual who loves God, loves junior and senior high youth, young adults and is gifted at planning lessons, recreation, and fellowship activities in a format that appeals to youth and young adults. The session has approved increasing this position to a half-time position and the Youth Director must be available Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings.

The Child Protection and Sexual Misconduct Policies and Procedures are now available on the FPC website. The Personnel committee spent several months revising the 2005 policy. The revised policy was referred to the Session and approved at the January 2018 meeting. We used the same guideline for revising this policy as the Grand Canyon Presbytery and General Assembly of PCUSA have used for their policies. This policy will be reviewed annually as mandated by Grand Canyon Presbytery.

Pastor Ann's schedule

The leaders of the congregation thought it would be helpful to reiterate my schedule, which mirrors that of your interim, Lois Hildenbrand. Because uninterrupted study and writing time is essential to sermon preparation, I work from home on Mondays praying, studying, and listening to God's voice with regards to the Scripture passage on which I will be preaching the following Sunday. I am in my study at church on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. During this time, I have many scheduled appointments and meetings and am also called out of the office for hospital and home visitation. Friday is my Sabbath time in which I rest and engage in re-creation. Typically, I do not check or respond to email on Friday.

As many of you know, with all of the deaths and funerals since the beginning of my ministry with you, Sabbath time has been in short supply. The Elders and those who served on the PNC have been concerned for the protection of this important time. A burned-out pastor is not an effective pastor. It is only when I am able to dwell deeply in God's Word and spend time in prayer and reflection that I am able to effectively minister to the needs of the congregation and community.

I am still discerning whether this is the best, most productive schedule for me and for the congregation, and I will keep you informed if it should change. My door is usually open, and I am available to meet with you for prayer and conversation. It is always helpful for me (and for you!) if you call to let me know you are coming and/or to schedule an appointment. That way, you won't drive to church only to find that I am away at a meeting, at the hospital, or visiting with someone in their home.

God has called us together in ministry and I give thanks for the blessing of serving as your pastor!
