A Message from Ann

“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” ~ words of Jesus recorded in Acts 1:8

Just prior to his ascension, Jesus spoke these words of promise, assuring his followers of his enduring presence with us through the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. This was quite a day for those first followers of Jesus!

The disciples were all gathered together when a rush of wind swept over them and tongues of fire rested upon them. Faithful Jews from all nations were in Jerusalem, and each heard testimony about God’s deeds of power in their own language. They were amazed!

Then Peter raised his voice, preaching a powerful sermon on that first Pentecost day. God’s Spirit, he said, would be poured out on all people! Peter bore witness to Christ’s resurrection: “This Jesus God raised up, and of that all of us are witnesses.” (Acts 2:32) “Therefore let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified.” (Acts 2:36)

We too have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit, and this is cause for both thanksgiving and celebration. The Spirit is God’s presence in the world and within individual believers. The Spirit is “everywhere the giver and renewer of life.” (Brief Statement of Faith) The Spirit leads us into all truth, and that truth is Jesus Christ. We are able to grow in knowledge of and intimacy with God through the Holy Spirit as the Spirit guides, supports, sustains, inspires, and enlivens us.

The Holy Spirit is our Advocate, Counselor, and Comforter. The Spirit comes alongside us, transforming us into the image of Christ and traveling our journey of faith with us, guiding us gently and patiently toward our true home in God. The Spirit teaches us to pray and intercedes on our behalf when we don’t know how to pray. It is by the power of the Holy Spirit at work within and among us that we are able to lead lives that reveal the love and power of God and witness to Christ as our Lord and Savior.

Friends, we have been called to witness to God’s love and grace and mercy and justice. This is a high and holy calling which would not be possible without God’s Holy Spirit leading us. May we listen well so that we may be led in the direction God would have us go and grow in our love for God and one another. May it be so!



Pentecost Offering – Psalm 71:17 says *“O God, from my youth you have taught me, and I still proclaim your wondrous deeds.”* The Pentecost Offering unites us in a churchwide effort to support young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church of the world. Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. The Holy Spirit remains with us still, connecting us with the church of the past, continuing to inspire the church of today, and pointing us to the church of the future. Studies show that a foundation of faith established during childhood through young adulthood, helps ensure lifelong faith and service. The patterns and lessons established during these formative years continue to bear fruit throughout a person’s life. A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and addresses the needs of at-risk children. 40% of the Pentecost offer is retained by the local church to designate how they want to use it to impact the lives of young people within their own community. The remaining 60% is used to support ministries connected to youth and young adults of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. (PCUSA Leadership Handbook)



Once again, the session has approved our 40% to be used for the mission trip to Tseyi Bidaa. Please prayerfully consider your gifts to the Pentecost Offering. The offering can be received any time up to and especially on Pentecost Sunday, which is May 20 this year.

Mission Trip Update – Praise God! We had 21 people indicate interest on coming on this year’s mission trip to Tseyi Bidaa. We have room for more and you can still get an application packet. We need more people this year as the folks up there are hoping to increase the number of children attending VBS. The first year, we averaged 20 children. Last year, we averaged 30 children. They are hoping for closer to 50 this year. What a wonderful opportunity to share in the message of our Lord’s love and to continue to develop our relationship. You are invited to continue to pray about your participation in the trip. Your prayers are welcome! May the Holy Spirit move in us as we prepare to go. See Sue Eisenklam for an application packet.
