Both the fall sermon series and the adult study portion of Wednesday WRAP (which I will be leading along with Carol Anderson) will focus our attention on what we Presbyterians have named the Great Ends. These six priorities, crafted in the early 20th century, help us as we live out our faith in the world. They not only guide the vision and mission of the PC(USA), but also ought to guide our vision and mission at FPC Mesa!

Summarizing why we exist as a Church, the Great Ends are:



- ❖ The proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind
- ❖ The shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God
- ❖ The maintenance of divine worship
- ❖ The preservation of the truth
- ❖ The promotion of social righteousness
- ❖ The exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world

As the Church loses (or has lost) its social prominence and is no longer a cultural norm as it was even just a few decades ago, we have been given the opportunity to define ourselves clearly to the surrounding culture. We need to know who we are and be able to articulate the essence of our faith. The Church began as a counter-cultural movement and we are now living into that same space again, many centuries later.

It is important that we welcome those who do not have a background in the church and come with faith questions and even doubt. As we share our own faith journeys with one another, we encourage each other in our own walk of faith and, in doing so, gain valuable experience in learning to tell others outside the church about our faith.

I hope you are as excited as I am to delve into this treasure trove from our forbearers in faith!

Please join us in worship on Sunday at 9:00 or 11:00 and also on Wednesday evenings from 5:00-7:00 as we explore together the unique way God is calling us to live into and live out the Great Ends of the Church!

International Mission Trip March 9-15, 2019 – The international mission trip has taken a different direction. For the last two – three years, the vision has been to go to Guatemala. It has become clear that the costs would be prohibitive. At our most recent mission trip, Leslie Vogel spoke of her new role as liaison to Mexico and Guatemala. It definitely felt like God was leading us in a different direction when Leslie spoke of border ministries. The mission commission has decided that the spring break 2019 mission trip will be to the US-Mexico border ministry in Aqua Prieta at Frontera de Cristo. If you are interested in this trip, mark your calendars and watch for more information to come soon. For sure, you will need a passport if you don’t already have one and you can start that process while waiting for the details to come.



Food Pantry – The food pantry has experienced a significant loss in donations. Sagewood Retirement Community has been providing food and toilet paper for four years. National Day of Remembrance 2018! *An Opportunity to serve on the anniversary of 9/11*

HandsOn Greater Phoenix, a member of the wider Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster Network, is partnering with 9/11day.org for the National Day of Remembrance 2018!

Together they are sponsoring a meal-packing which is part of a larger coordinated effort of similar events planned in Los Angeles, San Francisco and Phoenix. Your hands, heart, and willing spirit are needed to help them reach the goal of engaging 1500 volunteers (300-350 volunteers per shift over four 2-hour shifts), and to pack 250,000 meals per event. Meals will be immediately distributed - via local food banks, shelters, schools and other partners - to hungry families in each city.

This is part of 9/11 Day, a nonprofit that each year, leads the September 11 National Day of Service and Remembrance, a federally recognized annual observance and the nation's largest annual day of charitable engagement (30+ million participants). FROM THE CLERK'S DESK

There was no July Session meeting.

The officers and staff met in Retreat on Saturday morning, August 18th. Following lunch, the Deacons and Session held their separate August meetings.

From the Annual Officer/Staff Retreat:

- ❖ Items for discussion included our shared vision for our church. We reviewed what we discussed at last year's retreat and what we accomplished. We talked about doing ministry in this challenging new context of our post-modern and even post-Christian world.

From the Session meeting:

- ❖ Session approved a PW request to observe Communion at their Fall Gathering on October 13.
- ❖ A letter of resignation from Jasmine Couillard was read.
- ❖ The Clerk reported that our membership stands at 287 as of July 31.
- ❖ The June and July financial reports were approved.
- ❖ From the Administration Commission, (1) It looks like the manufacturer will end up having to replace the entire Sanctuary roof (at no cost to us) due to a defect in the tiles. (2) Two of our present gas lines will be closed off due to new AZ Corporation Commission gas line regulations. We are waiting on a final quote for the work that needs to be done. (3) 100 new LED ceiling lights are being installed to replace the old fluorescent ceiling lights. (4) A check has been received from our insurance company for the storm damage to the Fellowship Hall roof.
- ❖ The Nominating Committee is working to fill two vacancies on Session.
- ❖ The Personnel Committee received Session approval to create a new staff position: Minister of Faith Formation, a full-time, 35-hour per week position.

From Personnel Committee:

The Session has approved the creation of a new position, Minister of Faith Formation. This position is combining the $\frac{1}{2}$ time CE Director and $\frac{1}{4}$ time Youth Director into one full time position. The job description is posted on our website and we are actively searching for the person whom God is directing to our church. We covet your prayers and support during this transition time.


