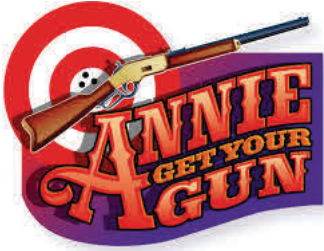

Christmas Angel Tree: Once again this year FPC Mesa is sponsoring local families in need this Christmas. We will be providing gifts for each family. The Christmas Angel Tree will be set up in the Sanctuary on Sunday, December 2nd, and decorated with paper angel ornaments labeled with family names and designated gift items. Please take an angel from the tree and purchase the gift requested. Wrap your gift with holiday paper and attach the angel on the outside of the gift. Gifts will be delivered on Sunday, December 16th, after church. If you have any questions, please contact Shelley Cronenberg at 480-239-1289. Café Justo - Many of you are familiar with Café Justo as it has been sold at our church in the past, as well as at Presbytery and other venues. It is a part of the ministry of Frontera de Cristo where our mission co-workers are. This is a way to address immigration at its roots. The Cooperative that grows and roasts the coffee receive the full cost of the coffee returned to them. In this way farmers receive a fair price for their coffee and communities are improved. Mission Commission and Session have agreed to use the last \$400 in the Mission Budget to purchase coffee and the books that tell the story of Café Justo. We will sell both starting December 9th during coffee time. The coffee and books make great Christmas gifts. The books cost \$20. A pound of organic shade grown Arabica regular or decaf coffee costs \$10. There will be medium and dark roast, ground and whole beans. If you buy a book and a pound of coffee, you will only pay \$25. We will also have stocking stuffers of different varieties in 4-oz size for \$2.50.



Deadline for Statement of Mission Interest is December 2nd. The statement is due with a fully refundable \$25. This is just an indication of interest not a full commitment. The Mission Trip Planning Team is hard at work preparing for the trip and need to have an idea how many will be going. The application packet will be ready by mid-December. Watch for the bulletin announcement saying when they will be ready to be picked up.

Christmas Joy Offering - During this Advent Season, we celebrate leadership: past, present and future through support of this offering. We do so because church leaders greatly impact our lives of faith, walking with us down the path to be more like Jesus. The funds go to support the Board of Pensions which honors

the faithfulness of current and retired church workers and their families in need. Another way our contributions work is to prepare the way for future leaders. The PC(USA) has long promoted education and leadership development through the establishment and support of Presbyterian-related schools and colleges

equipping communities of color. The Christmas Joy Offering supports Menaul School in Albuquerque, New Mexico, Presbyterian Pan American School in Kingsville Texas, and Stillman college in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The offering will be received from December 2nd-23rd. December 23rd is when we will gather our gifts, but you are welcome to give your gift earlier if you know you won't be in town.
