If Jesus is truly God, everything is clear; if I cannot believe this, everything darkens again."

My friends, everything will not darken again; for the Light has come! The Light shines in the darkness and the darkness will never overcome it.

My prayer for us all then is that we would take some time to truly dwell in Christ's Light. My prayer is that we would settle in and enjoy the Twelve Days of Christmas ~ the special time between Christmas and Epiphany when we have the opportunity to soak in the blessings of Christ's coming; to relax and unwind a bit after all of the preparations of the season; to be with

those we love and love those whom we are with. It is a time to reflect, both inwardly on God's love for us and outwardly in the sense of reflecting God's love out into our world.

Know that you are deeply loved by a God who IS love! May the deep peace of Christ be with us all, now and forever.

It is actually easier for them to use the larger size bottles, so we will gladly accept larger sizes of those items and thank you to whoever donated those bottles that just showed up!

This is only a once a month commitment (usually Wednesday / Thursday following 1st and 3rd Sundays). My hope is that with all the new towels, sheets and blankets it will streamline the storage process for the next Sunday. And thank you to Paul Harding for picking it all up every Monday.
